### INNOCENCE OF LIFE

Among the moral virtues which we try to cultivate in our Christian life is one which includes a great many other virtues within it. That virtue is "innocence-of-life". Innocence-oflife encompasses the signal virtues of chastity and continence, but also a whole approach to life which deliberately avoids acquaintance with evil, and seeks out what is good and honorable and pure. In St. Paul's Epistle to the Philippians we find a stirring exhortation to this innocence of life: "For the rest, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever modest, whatsoever just, whatsoever holy, whatsoever lovely, whatsoever of good fame, if there be any virtue, if any praise of discipline: think on these things." (Philippians 4:8)

Innocence of life calls us to refine our manners: to be careful of the language we use, the things we talk about, the way we dress. A Christian should recognize coarseness for what it is and not be fooled into thinking that "it's more real".

In the formation of our children and our youth coming-of-age, innocence of life is an important counter weight to the peer-pressures of the popular culture. For adults, seeing the natural innocence of young children and feeling protective towards them, there can be an experience of renewal in their own moral lives—a heartfelt longing to strengthen or recover character traits of modesty, purity, guilelessness and simplicity.

During this month of May, the Month of Mary, it is an especially good time to pray for the grace of (and put into practice) the virtue of innocence of life.

**INTROIT:** Isaias 48: 20 Declare it with the voice of joy, and make it known, alleluia: declare it even to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. Psalm 65: 1-2 Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise. V. Glory be to the Father.

**COLLECT** O God, from whom all good things do proceed, grant unto Thy humble servants, that by Thy holy inspiration, we may think those things that are right, and under Thy guidance may perform the same. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** James 1: 22-27 Dearly beloved, be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass: for he beheld himself and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

**FIRST ALLELUIA** Alleluia, alleluia. V. Christ is risen, and hath shone upon us, whom He redeemed with His blood.

**SECOND ALLELUIA: John 16: 28** Alleluia. V. I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. Alleluia.

Hitherto you have not asked any thing in My name: Ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs. The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

**OFFERTORY:** Psalm 65: 8-9, 20 O bless the Lord our God, ye peoples, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved. Blessed be the Lord, who hath not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me, alleluia.

**SECRET** Receive, O Lord, the prayers and sacrifices of the faithful, that by these offices of loving devotion we may attain to heavenly glory. Through our Lord.
