"TO MAKE OF ALL MY LIFE A MASS..."

Any years ago, a priest friend of mine sent me a holy card from France to greet me on my anniversary of priestly ordination. The holy card, which I have reproduced here, shows a priest elevating a ciborium of hosts for the consecration of the Mass. The French phrase



translates as: "To make of all my life a Mass and of the Mass all my life." This phrase has obvious meaning for a priest who has given his

Faire de toute ma vie une Messe et de la Messe toute ma vie .

life to offer prayer and sacrifice to God on behalf of the People of God through the celebration of Mass. The priest who has received the Sacrament of Holy Orders gives himself over to Jesus Christ in order for Christ to act through him in the representation of the one sacrifice on Mount Calvary. In truth, there is only One Priest who ever says Mass: that One Priest is Jesus Christ, Who is at once both Priest and Victim on the altar. All of the men ordained priests are sharers in this One Priesthood of Christ. This is the meaning behind the expression that the priest acts in persona Christi (i.e., in the person of Christ). It is a theologically factual statement. How then could a priest *not* make the Eucharist the center of his life?

But this beautiful phrase: "To make of all my life a Mass and of the Mass all my life", has a wider application to every baptized Christian, male and female, who also have a sharing in Christ's priesthood, albeit not to the same extraordinary degree of an ordained priest. It is lamentable that in our time some within the Church have invoked the "priesthood of the faithful" in such a way as to diminish the significance of the "priesthood of the ordained." At the same time, we do not want to defend the priesthood of the ordained by minimizing or obscuring the significance of the priesthood of the faithful either.

The essence of the Mass is the self-giving, sacrificing love of God in Jesus Christ poured forth upon the world. Our response to it as a "priestly people" is to reciprocate as much as we can with a love which is also self-giving and self-sacrificing. When assisting at Mass we consciously, with grateful love, offer ourselves to Christ on the altar—all that we are, all that we have. And when we go out about our business in the world that spirit of self-less charity goes out with us to give shape and purpose to our lives.

Engaged couples should make arrangements with the parish church so as to allow for adequate sacramental preparation (six months), including a Pre-Cana program.
