Pastor's Note

ST. BLAISE, BISHOP & MARTYR

Jollowing directly after Candlemas Day is the tradition of the Blessing of Throats in honor of St. Blaise. A Christian martyr of the early 4th century, he once touched the throat of a boy who was choking to death from a bone. This miracle is recalled in today's throat blessing. We gain an understanding of the larger divine power behind such sacramental objects in the complete prayer for St. Blaise from the Ritual:

O God most powerful and most kind, You created all the different things in the world by the Word alone and willed that this Word by which all things were made should become incarnate for the remaking of mankind. You are great and limitless, worthy of reverence and praise, the worker of wonders. For Your sake the glorious martyr and bishop, Saint Blaise, joyfully gained the palm of martyrdom, never shrinking from any kind of torture in confessing his faith in You, and You gave to him, among other gifts, the prerogative of curing by Your power every ailment of men's

throats. Humbly we beg You in Your majesty not to look upon our guilt but, pleased by His merits and prayers, in Your awe-inspiring kindness, to bless this wax created by You and to sanctify it, pouring into it Your grace. May all who in good faith have their throats touched by this wax be freed from every ailment of the throat through the merit of his suffering and, in good health and spirits, give thanks to You in Your Holy Church and praise Your glorious name, which is blessed forever and ever. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Your Son, who with You lives and reigns in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, world without end. Amen.

We see in the prayer of the Blessing for St. Blaise Day a confession of faith in the Incarnation, which mystery we have just celebrated in the Christmas season. For it is from that Incarnation that all of the miracleworking power of the Saints derives.

This past Tuesday, January 29th, the Boston Globe ran a front-page feature story on the little baby boy we have been praying for—Dominic Gundrum. The article is entitled: With Resolve on All Sides, a Life Made Whole: Family's Agonizing Trail Leads to Infant's Rare Surgery at Children's. I encourage you to read it in order to gain an idea of the enormity of this child's story. The doctors have told the parents he will walk and talk. "Developmentally, he seems to be appropriate for his age [7 months]," the chief surgeon is quoted in the story. "I think it's entirely possible that he will be an entirely normal little guy."






"BRING-A-SAINT-AND-LUNCH" Thursday, February 7th, A.D. 2013

LATIN MASS TEXTS Traditional Propers: Sexagesima Sunday

Vestments: Violet

INTROIT: Ps. 43. 23-26 Arise, why sleepest Thou, O Lord? arise, and cast us not off to the end. Why turnest Thou Thy face away, and forgettest our trouble? our belly hath cleaved to the earth: arise, O Lord, help us and deliver us. *Psalm 43.2* We have heard, O God, with our ears: our fathers have declared to us. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, Who seest that we put not our trust in anything that we do; mercifully grant that by the protection of the Doctor of the Gentiles we may be defended against all adversity. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: 2 Corinthians 11. 19-33; 12. 1-9

Brethren: You gladly suffer the foolish: whereas yourselves are wise. For you suffer if a man bring you into bondage, if a man devour you, if a man take from you, if a man be lifted up, if a man strike you on the face. I speak according to dishonour, as if we had been weak in this part. Wherein if any man dare (I speak foolishly), I dare also. They are Hebrews, so am I. They are Israelites, so am I. They are the seed of Abraham, so am I. They are the ministers of Christ (I speak as one less wise), I am more: in many more labours, in prisons more frequently, in stripes above measure, in deaths often. Of the Jews, five times did I receive forty stripes save one. Thrice was I beaten with rods, once I was stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I was in the depth of the sea: in journeying often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils from my own nation, in perils from the Gentiles, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils from false brethren: in labour and painfulness, in much watching, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness; besides those things which are without, my daily instance, the solicitude for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not weak? who is scandalized, and I am not on fire? If I must needs glory, I will glory of things that concern my infirmity. The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who is blessed forever, knoweth that I lie not. At Damascus the governor of the nation under Aretas the king guarded the city of the Damascenes, to apprehend me: and through a window in a basket (continued on page 8) (continued from page 7)

was I let down by the wall, and so escaped his hands. If I must glory (it is not expedient indeed) but I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ about fourteen years ago, whether in the body I know not, or out of the body I know not, God knoweth, such a one caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man, whether in the body or out of the body I know not, God knoweth: that he was caught up into paradise, and heard secret words which it is not granted man to utter. For such a one, I will glory: but for myself I will glory nothing but in my infirmities. For, though I have a mind to glory, I shall not be foolish: for I will say the truth: but I forbear, lest any man should think of me above that which he seeth in me, or anything he heareth from me. And lest the greatness of the revelations should exalt me, there was given me a sting of my flesh, and angel of Satan, to buffet me. For which thing, thrice I besought the Lord that it might depart from me. And He said to me: My grace is sufficient for thee, for power is made perfect in infirmity. Gladly therefore will I glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may dwell in me.

GOSPEL: Luke 8. 4-15 At that time, when a very great multitude was gathered together and hastened out of the cities unto Jesus, He spoke by a similitude: The sower went out to sow his seed: and as he sowed, some fell by the way side; and it was trodden down, and the fowls of the air devoured it. And other some fell upon a rock: and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And other some fell among thorns, and the thorns growing up with it choked it. And other some fell upon good ground: and being sprung up yielded fruit a hundredfold. Saying these things, He cried

disciples asked Him what this parable might be. To whom He said: To you it is given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest in parables: that seeing they may not see, and hearing may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. And they by the way side are they that hear: then the devil cometh and taketh the word out of their heart, lest believing they should be saved. Now they upon the rock are they who, when they hear receive the word with joy; and these have no roots: for they believe for a while, and in time of temptation they fall away. And that which fell among thorns are they who have heard and, going their way, are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and yield no fruit. But that on the good ground are they who in a good and perfect heart, hearing the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit in patience.
