



# LOURDES AT 155 YEARS

The 155th Anniversary of the first Apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Bernadette Soubirous—February 11th, 1858 will fall on Monday this year. This is our parish patronal feast day. I encourage those who are able to attend Mass at the parish on Monday, either at 7:30 AM or at the Latin Low Mass at 12:30 PM. Please remember at least to pray for the intention of our parish on this day.

This year, since Ash Wednesday comes so close upon February 11th, we will not have a special sung Mass in the evening as we have had in recent years. Instead, we will wait until Monday, April 8th, to celebrate a Traditional Latin High Mass for the Feast of the Annunciation. (The Annunciation is March 25th, but owing to the early date of Easter it is transferred this year to April 8th.) You will recall that this Feast of the Annunciation has an important connection in the history of the Apparitions at Lourdes. It was on March 25th, 1858, when the mysterious heavenly lady finally answered Bernadette's question: *What is your*  name?. She replied: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

In 1858, February 11th fell on the Thursday before Ash Wednesday. The Second Apparition, February 14th, was on this Sunday before Lent, and the third, February 18th, was Thursdayafter-Ash. It was at this 3rd Apparition that Bernadette first heard the beautiful lady speak. It is always poignant then when the occurrence of the Feast of Lourdes falls around the beginning of Lent, as it does this year.

On Wednesday of this coming week, February 13th, we observe Ash Wednesday, and begin the Great Fast of Lent in preparation for Easter. These next three days are the days to make our Lenten resolutions for 2013 and lay out our personal Lenten program for our hoped-for spiritual growth. The Mass times for Ash Wednesday and the Lenten Regulations are in the announcements on the next page.

#### DAVID ALLEN: OUR NEW PASTORAL ASSOCIATE

This Sunday I want to introduce a new member to our Parish Staff from among our parishioners. He is David Allen and he will begin working in the parish on a part-time basis. David is currently working on his Master's degree in Theological Studies for the New Evangelization at St. John's Seminary, Brighton. He completed his undergraduate degree in Biblical and Theological Studies at Gordon College in Wenham, MA, in 2009. He also taught Theology at St. Clement's High School in Medford. David and his wife Ellen are both cantors in our Music Ministry. I have asked David initially to concentrate his work in assisting with the pastoral care of the Catholic residents in the two nursing homes we cover: the Stone Institute and the Wingate Manor. # ASH WEDNESDAY: FEBRUARY 13th, A.D. 3013



Masses at 7:30 AM (English) —12:30 PM (Latin)—5:30 PM (English Sung Mass)— 7:30 PM (Traditional Latin Sung Mass)


The Blessed Ashes will be imposed at all the Masses.

ASH WEDNESDAY is an obligatory day of fast for all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 Inclusive, and of abstinence from flesh meat from the age of 14.

# LENTEN REGULATIONS

- Abstinence from Flesh Meat: obliges beginning on a person's 14th birthday and applies to Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
  - 2. Practice of Penance: all Catholics should perform some act of penance on the weekdays of Lent (for example, our personal Lenten sacrifices), and Fridays throughout the year (for example, not eating meat on Friday).
- 3. Days of Fast: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. On these 2 days of the year all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to fast according to the guideline of 1 full-meal permitted and 2 smaller meals allowed to maintain strength.

Any person is free to observe the more stringent laws of abstinence, penance and fast in place before 1965 for himself, provided he understands that he cannot impose that same strictness on others.



FRIDAY DEVOTIONS DURING LENT: "VIA CRUCIS"—TRADITIONAL STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be held on all Fridays during Lent at 7:30 PM in the main church, followed by a Lenten sermon, the distribution of Holy Communion outside of Mass, and concluding with Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

This Year's Lenten Sermon Theme will be the PLOT TO KILL GOD, reflections on the Soviet Union's 70 year attempt to make religion disappear from the minds of men. The main source for these sermons is Paul Froese's 2008 book: The Plot to Kill God: Findings from the Soviet Experimentation in Secularization.

#### Bernadette's Account:

"I had gone down one day with two other girls to the bank of the river Gave when suddenly I heard a kind of rustling sound. I turned my head toward the field by the side of the river but the trees seemed quite still and the noise was evidently not from them. Then I looked up and caught sight of the cave where I saw a lady wearing a lovely white dress with a bright belt. On top of each of her feet was a pale yellow rose, the same color as her rosary beads. At this I rubbed my eyes, thinking I was seeing things, and I put my hands into the folds of my dress where my rosary was. I wanted to make the Sign of the Cross but for the life of me I couldn't manage it and my hand just fell down. Then the lady made the Sign of the Cross herself and at the second attempt I managed to do the same, though my hands were trembling. Then I began to say the rosary while the lady let her beads slip through her fingers, without moving her lips. When I stopped saying the Hail Mary, she immediately vanished. I asked my two companions if they had noticed anything, but they said no. Of course they wanted to know what I was doing and I told them that I had seen a lady wearing a nice white dress, though I didn't know who she was. I told them not to say anything about it, and they said I was

silly to have anything to do with it. I said they were wrong and I came back next Sunday, feeling myself drawn to the place...The third time I went the lady spoke to me and asked me to come every day for fifteen days. I said I would and then she said that she wanted me to tell the priests to build a chapel there...

**INTROIT: Ps. 30. 3-4** Be Thou unto me a God, a protector, and a place of refuge to save me: for Thou art my strength and my refuge: and for Thy name's sake Thou wilt lead me, and nourish me. *Psalm* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and save me. *V*. Glory be to the Father.

**COLLECT** We beseech Thee, O Lord, mercifully hear our prayers, that being loosed from the bonds of our sins, we may be defended by Thee against all adversity. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE: I Corinthians 13. 1-13** Brethren: If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I should have prophecy, and should know all mysteries, and all knowledge; and I should have all faith so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And if I should distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I should deliver my body to be burned and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind; Charity envieth not, dealeth not perversely, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, seeketh not her own, is not provoked to anger, thinketh no evil, rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth with the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never falleth away; whether prophecies shall be made void, or tongues shall cease, or knowledge shall be destroyed. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child. But when I became a man, I put away the things of a child. We see now through a glass in a dark manner: but then face to face. Now I know in part: but then I shall know even as I am known. And now there remain faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

**GRADUAL: Ps. 76. 15-16** Thou art the God that alone dost wonders: Thou hast made Thy power known among the nations. *V*. With Thy arm Thou hast delivered Thy people, the children of Israel and of Joseph.
