#### **Pastor's Note**

#### THE BODY OF CHRIST

As of the printing deadline for submission of this Note, the College of Cardinals is on its second day of voting and no Pope has yet been selected. It is still expected that by today (Sunday) we will have seen a new Pope from the balcony of St. Peter's. But, if not...

In the course of the liturgical season, we are now entering upon the last two weeks before Easter Sunday, "Passiontide". The statues and crosses of the church interior are veiled in the colors of mourning. Next Sunday will be Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. The schedule for our Parish Holy Week Services is printed on page 5 of this week's bulletin. I encourage you to plan your schedules so that you might participate in as much of the Sacred Triduum as you can, beginning with the Office of Tenebrae on Spy Wednesday, March 27th. Our focus on these two weeks of the year is on the Sufferings of Christ in His Passion.

It is sometimes said that the Agony of Christ's Passion will last until the end of the world. Well we might wonder how this is so if Christ rose from the dead, is glorified and ascended into Heaven, and can never die again? How can both be true?

First of all, the sufferings of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which occurred historically during His 33 years of visible life on the earth, are in a mysterious way continually preserved in the Blessed Sacrament. This is something which ever draws us in when we pray before the Eucharist.

Secondly, Christ's sufferings continue through history in the sufferings of the world—His Body. This is the sense of the words of the Risen Christ to Saul when he is struck down from his horse on the Road to Damascus: "Saul! Saul! Why persecutest thou Me?" (Acts of the Apostles 9:4) Christ is in Heaven. Saul cannot touch Him there. But the faithful disciples of Christ form Christ's Mystical Body, and they do suffer. In these two senses, Christ's Agony continues until the end of the world, something for us to ponder especially during these days of Passiontide.

# LATIN MASS TEXTS Traditional Propers Passion Sunday

Vestments: Violet

**INTROIT:** Psalm 42: 1-2 Judge me, O God, and distinguish my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the unjust and deceitful man: for Thou art my God and my strength. *Psalm 42: 3* O send out Thy light and Thy truth: they have led me and brought me unto Thy holy hill, even unto Thy tabernacles.

**COLLECT** We beseech Thee, almighty God, mercifully look upon Thy family: that by Thy great goodness it may be governed in body and by Thy protection be preserved in mind. Through our Lord. **EPISTLE: Hebrews 9: 11-15** Brethren: Christ being come, an High Priest of the good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is, not of this creation: neither by the blood of goats or of calves, but by His own blood, entered once into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and of oxen and the ashes of an heifer, being sprinkled, sanctify such as are defiled, to the cleansing of the flesh: how much more shall the blood of Christ, who, by the Holy Ghost, offered Himself unspotted unto God, cleanse our conscience from dead works, to serve the living God? And therefore He is the Mediator of the new testament: that by means of His death, for the redemption of those transgressions which were under the former testament, they that are called may receive the promise of eternal inheritance, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

**GRADUAL: Psalm 142: 9, 10; 17: 48-49** Deliver me, O Lord, from my enemies: teach me to do Thy will. Psalm 17: 48-49 My deliverer, O Lord, from the angry nations: Thou wilt lift me up above them that rise up against me: from the unjust man Thou wilt deliver me.

**TRACT: Psalm 128: 1-4** Often have they fought against me from my youth. *V*. Let Israel now say: often have they fought against me from my youth. *V*. But they could not prevail over me: the wicked have wrought upon my back. *V*. They have lengthened their iniquities: the Lord who is just will cut the necks of sinners.

**GOSPEL: John 8: 46-59** At that time, Jesus said to the multitudes of the Jews: Which of you shall

convince Me of sin? If I say the truth to you, why do you not believe Me? He that is of God heareth the words of God. Therefore you hear them not, because you are not of God. The Jews therefore answered, and said to Him: Do not we say well, that Thou art a Samaritan, and hast a devil? Jesus answered: I have not a devil: but I honour My Father, and you have dishonoured Me. But I seek not My own glory: there is One that seeketh and judgeth. Amen, amen, I say to you: If any man keep My word, he shall not see death for ever. The Jews therefore said: Now we know that Thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets: and Thou sayest: If any man keep My word he shall not taste death for ever. Art Thou greater than our father Abraham, who is dead? and the prophets are dead, whom dost Thou make Thyself? Jesus answered: If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing: it is My Father that glorifieth Me, of whom you say that He is your God, and you have not known Him: but I know Him: And if I shall say that I know Him not, I shall be like to you, a liar. But I do know Him, and do keep His word. Abraham your father rejoiced that he might see My day: he saw it and was glad. The Jews therefore said to Him: Thou art not yet fifty years old: and hast Thou seen Abraham? Jesus said to them: Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham was made, I am. They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple.

**OFFERTORY: Psalm 118: 17, 107** I will confess to Thee, O Lord, with my whole heart: render to Thy servant: I shall live and keep Thy words: enliven me according to Thy word, O Lord.

**SECRET** May these offerings, we beseech Thee, O Lord, loosen the bonds of our wickedness, and procure for us the gifts of Thy mercy. Through our Lord.

# GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS FOR CHILDREN


At 12 Noon on Good Friday, our Religious Education Director Jean Johnson will lead a Stations of the Cross for children in the Main Church.



FRIDAY DEVOTIONS DURING LENT:

"VIA CRUCIS"—TRADITIONAL
STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be held on all Fridays during Lent at 7:30 PM in the main church, followed by a Lenten sermon, the distribution of Holy Communion outside of Mass, and concluding with Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

This Year's Lenten Sermon Theme will be the PLOT TO KILL GOD, reflections on the Soviet Union's 70 year attempt to make religion disappear from the minds of men. The main source for these sermons is Paul Froese's 2008 book: The Plot to Kill God: Findings from the Soviet Experimentation in Secularization.



"Communist Party elites established atheist alternatives to religious ceremonies with no clear secular meaning...In a sample text from a Soviet 'Baptism', parents and members of the gathering first pledge to raise the child in the proper moral (meaning anti-religious) environment. Then a Soviet official recites a series of invocations over the baby such as the following:

Life becomes much brighter and more beautiful Much quicker in its wonderful course Suddenly here in our Soviet family A small person is born.

Today we are celebrating in honor of him to whom Belongs the future, and we are saying to him, 'Hail, new citizen of our great Soviet state!" —Paul Froese, The Plot to Kill God
