THE EASTER SEASON JOURNEY

3 want to express my thanks on behalf of the whole parish to all those who worked so hard to make the observance of Holy Week such a beautiful and reverent experience of divine worship. I want to commend Mrs. Bobbie Hoffmann, our parish music director, and to all the singers and musicians of our music ministry for the dedication of so much of their time to carry out the long solemn liturgies of Holy Week. I also want to commend the members of our staff, Manny Goguen, Margie Bibbo and Laurie Spinelli for all of the extra work they put in during the whole of Passiontide, together with the whole team of our parish Sacristans and our altar servers. The smooth performance of the intricate liturgical ceremonies of Holy Week for the Extraordinary Form was due to the guidance of our parish Master of Ceremonies Andrew Provencher. Unsung heroes are the volunteers, young and old, who dedicated their time Holy Saturday morning to decorate the main church and give it a last polish before the

Masses of Easter Day. Thank you to one and all.

Now that we have begun to celebrate the Easter Feast after so many weeks of preparation, it is fitting that we should trace out the "journey" of Easter. During Easter Week, in the liturgy we hear the great themes of the Resurrected Christ's appearances and the grace of supernatural life which comes to us through the waters of Baptism.

The Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Eucharist are the Sacraments which command our especial attention during Eastertide. St. John testifies that he saw blood and water flowing from the wounded side of Christ on Good Friday. In the image of the Divine Mercy (which hangs in our church on the sanctuary wall behind the pulpit) the white and the red streams which flow from Christ's Sacred Heart are that blood and water which mystically represent these two Sacraments—Eucharist and Baptism.

The custom of children receiving their First Holy Communion in parishes during Eastertide is linked to this heightened focus on the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. At Mary Immaculate of Lourdes we will have First Holy Communion on May 5th at the 9 AM Mass (Ordinary Form) and on May 12th at the 10:30 AM Mass (Extraordinary Form).

The Easter season officially ends (according to the traditional liturgical calendar) on Saturday of Pentecost Week, but, in effect, it is the outward observances of Corpus Christi (this year on June 2nd) which cap the triumphant Procession of the Risen Christ at Easter.

SECOND ALLELUIA: John 10: 14 Alleluia. *V.* I am the good shepherd: and I know My sheep, and Mine know Me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 10: 11-16 At that time Jesus said to the Pharisees: I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd giveth his life for his sheep. But the hireling, and he that is not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming and leaveth

the sheep and flieth: and the wolf catcheth and scattereth the sheep: and the hireling flieth, because he is a hireling, and he hath no care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd: and I know Mine, and Mine know Me, as the Father knoweth Me, and I know the Father: and I lay down My life for My sheep. And other sheep I have that are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear My voice, and there shall be one fold and one shepherd.




