

#### **Pastor's Note**

#### THE VOICE OF JEREMIAH

In the Old Testament of the Bible the Prophet Jeremiah has the unhappy duty of delivering the bad news of what is about to befall Jerusalem and the whole Jewish Nation. Since his warnings go unheeded, the worst predictions come true to the letter. The city of Jerusalem is taken by storm: the Temple of Solomon is destroyed: much of the surviving population is herded off into slavery in Babylon.

Since Jeremiah is such a doleful figure in the Old Testament history, his name has become a

byword for any denunciatory complaint or tirade: a *jeremiad*.

Recently the New York Times Book Review published a review of the latest book by Boston University Professor Andrew J. Bacevich, a book entitled Breach of Trust: How Americans Failed Their Soldiers and Their Country. It would seem this book deserves the title of a jeremiad, for it is unsparing in its calling out of many of his fellow Americans for lending their support to the wars our all-volunteer military has been sent into these past twelve years. Professor Bacevich is a retired colonel, a Vietnam combat veteran, and a West Point graduate. His son First Lt. Andrew John Bacevich was killed in combat north of Baghdad in 2007.

As his reviewer says: The visceral depth of his disgust for war itself— "an unvarnished evil"— is matched only by his insistence that we stop expressing corporate-manufactured, guilt assuaging "support" for the troops, and instead that we actually love them in the most elemental way: by protecting them from harm.

In light of the present crises around the civil war in Syria and another likely US military intervention, we would do well to heed such a *jeremiad*. Again, I quote from the review:

What is successful is the persuasiveness of Bacevich's argument—through this and his last several books—that we try to use the United States military against problems that have no military solution, and in ways that exacerbate our inclination to overuse it in the first place. In "Breach of Trust"...Bacevich dismantles the warrior myth we civilians and politicians so enjoy worshipping from afar, and replaces that idol with flesh and blood, vulnerable humans, who deserve better than the profligate, wasteful way in which we treat them.

# KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH





GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY Luke 2:22-38 Part 2

In last week's column, I discussed the significance of Christ's Presentation and Mary's Purification in the Temple, as well as Simeon's canticle. This week, I would like to explore the meaning of Simeon's prophetic words to Mary following

his canticle, as well St. Luke's inclusion of Anna at the end of this narrative.

Simeon tells Mary that Christ "is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted" (v. 34). Sobering words to hear about your gurgling little baby, to say the least! They are totally in line, however, with Mary's own revelation about her Son in the *Magnificat*. In 1:51-53, Mary prophesies that God has reversed the fortunes of the rich and the poor, the powerful and the weak. What both Simeon and Mary know is that Jesus will manifest His divine power over the works of the devil, casting him down, and will associate Himself with those in both spiritual and physical need, ministering to them with authentic compassion and solidarity.

What shall we make of Simeon's ascription, "sign of contradiction"? Likewise, why does he tell Mary that her own heart would be pierced, and that these two things would cause "the thoughts of many

hearts [to] be revealed" (v. 35)? Many commentators (including Bl. John Paul II) agree that Simeon is foretelling the Passion, which will reveal where people stand in relation to Christ: either as faithful and repentant disciples, or as those who oppose His divine claims and shout "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Thus, Simeon likewise speaks directly to the fact that the crucifixion will tear Mary's soul to shreds, as the death of any child does for a mother. Our Catholic theological tradition holds that there is more here, though, than the anguish of a mother-son bond being destroyed by outside forces.

The Church teaches, and so we believe, that through her anguish beside the cross of her Son, Mary participated in Christ's redeeming work for all mankind in a preeminent way (Catechism of the Catholic Church nos. 968-970). By consenting to the Father's plan in Christ, she participated through her intercession, indeed, through her very being, in the all-sufficient redemptive sacrifice of Calvary, joining her motherly sacrifice to that of her Son. Now that Christ is risen and glorified, and the merits of his death and resurrection are applied to human souls through the Church, Mary continues to be associated with her Son's work. She is rightly called the Mother of the Church, because she cares so deeply for the souls of all of those for whom her Son died. What a thrilling consolation- far from holding the death of her Son against us, Mary greatly delights in drawing us, through her prayers, to the full life of redemption and salvation that her Son has won for us! Thanks be to God! In the Byzantine Divine Liturgy, there is an antiphonal refrain in the Liturgy of the Word that summarizes this truth so eloquently and simply: "Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Savior, save us!" What a wonderfully fitting (and easy!) prayer to remember as we prepare ourselves for Mass, which is the re-presentation of Calvary.

Now a word about Anna. St. Luke tells us that Anna was the female counterpart to Simeon. Deeply prayerful and full of the Holy Spirit, she recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, and prophesied about Him to all the people in Jerusalem (vv. 37-38). In first century Palestine, the opinion of women was often discounted as either unreliable or irrelevant. For St. Luke to mention Anna at all was to push against the social conventions of his day. It also indicates that the primitive Church enhanced

the dignity of women, because it considered their witness to the Gospel just as valuable as that of men, as the Orthodox Study Bible indicates. All of us, whether male or female, have equal dignity before God. Each of us has unique gifts from the Holy Spirit by virtue of our baptism and confirmation, by which we may testify to our faith in Jesus Christ (*Catechism* nos. 768, 798-801, 1266,

1303). (David Allen)




