#### **Pastor's Note**

#### THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

December 8th is one of the great feast days of the Catholic Church: the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This Catholic belief was solemnly defined by Pope Pius IX in an exercise of his authority to teach as Christ's Vicar on earth—ex cathedra, that is, from the teaching chair of St. Peter. The entry in the Roman breviary for December 8th recalls this historic event:

On December 8th, 1854, in the Vatican Basilica, in the presence of a vast assembly of Fathers of the Roman Church, including cardinals and

bishops from the most distant countries and with the applause of the whole world, he solemnly declared and defined: The doctrine which holds that the most blessed Virgin Mary, at the first instant of her conception, by a singular privilege granted her by God, was preserved from any stain of original sin, is a doctrine taught and revealed by God, and is therefore to be believed with firmness and constancy by all the faithful.

Four years later, in 1858 during the course of Bernadette Soubirous' experience of the Blessed Virgin's apparitions, the decisive moment when her pastor believed that the girl had received an authentic revelation, was when she came back to him with the answer to his question, "What is your name?" The unidentified girl of the grotto had said to Bernadette: "I am the Immaculate Conception." The poor girl of Lourdes had no idea what that meant, but the parish priest knew indeed.

Our nation of the United States has been placed under the protection of this mystery of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Our great national basilica in Washington, D.C., is the basilica of the Immaculate Conception. As Mary Immaculate of Lourdes parish we have an added connection to this December 8th feast-day since Mary chose to identify herself by this privilege— I am the Immaculate Conception—at Lourdes.

It is quite easy to place this feast into the themes of the Advent season as well. The Prophet Isaias' words "Behold a Virgin shall conceive and bear a Son", foretelling the miraculous conception and child-bearing of Mary, contains within it the mystery of faith of Mary's Immaculate Conception, since her singular preservation from the universal stain of original sin was part of her preparation to one day become the Mother of our Savior Jesus Christ.

# KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH





GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY Luke 4:40-44

The news about the healing of Simon Peter's mother-in-law was so contagious, that people were naturally drawn to seek Jesus. This, of course, continues the fulfillment Jesus' own Isaian mission statement that He proclaimed in Nazareth (cf. 4:18-19), as Tannehill's commentary points out. And so, the

recurring motif of Jesus' concern for the poor and lowly is again brought to the fore. These few verses following the healing of Simon Peter's mother-in-law have bearing on our understanding of the true nature of evangelization. Spreading the good news about Jesus and His Church does *not* consist in bigger and better programs (regardless of how good these may seem to be), but in the encounter of individual hurting people with the compassion of the Savior in the sacraments.


In his recent interview in the Jesuit magazine *America*, Pope Francis called the Church a "field hospital," indicating the dire need of so many for God's mercy, especially in Confession. Cardinal Dolan touched on this topic a year ago. Taking his cue from Pope Benedict XVI's address at the opening of the Synod on the New Evangelization, Dolan, in his November 2012 presidential address to the USCCB called the Sacrament of Confession the "sacrament of the New Evangelization." Citing the pope emeritus, he explained that "conversion" is

at the heart of what it means to share and experience the good news. Elaborating, he wrote, "We cannot engage culture unless we let Him first engage us; we cannot dialogue with others unless we first dialogue with Him; we cannot challenge unless we first let Him challenge us." In other words, all of the Church's activities in spreading the good news mean little, unless our own on-going conversion is the top priority. The final one-liner of Dolan's speech: "First things first."

This kind of evangelism stems directly from the example of our Lord in this passage from St. Luke. It is *people*-centered (not structure-centered or program-centered), and its methodology is mercy. What Jesus does in Capernaum is what He does everywhere. He liberates people from the crippling effects of illness (whether spiritual or physical), and from the deception and oppression of the demonic. In response to the crowd's desire for Him to stay in Capernaum, Jesus underlines the urgency of His mission of dispensing the "good news" of His mercy to others, too (v. 43). At Advent and Christmastide, how appropriate it is for us to make a good confession, and encounter the loving embrace of the Christ Child.

The Navarre Study Bible also draws attention to Jesus' tenderness in His *laying hands* on each individual. This physical gesture symbolizes the power and grace of God coming upon someone for healing and forgiveness. This gesture has fittingly continued into the sacramental system of the Church, especially in the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, quoting Pope St. Leo the Great, "what was visible in our Savior has passed over into His mysteries" (CCC no. 1115).

Finally, this passage shows us that Jesus Himself needed periodic solitude. After healing so many people, "He went to a deserted place" (v. 42). Jesus needed physical and spiritual rest (do we allow ourselves to rest?). How can we expect to hear the voice of our Heavenly Father and to know his will, unless, like Jesus, we take time to be quiet with Him in prayer? Advent is a perfect time to reinvigorate our daily prayer life, and draw nearer to God, whose love is present to us at every moment, even when we are oblivious to it. Let us become more keenly aware of His presence among us, because this is *exactly* what Christmas is all about! *(David Allen)*



## LATIN MASS TEXTS: THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY (Commemoration of the Second Sunday of Advent)

INTROIT: Isaias 61: 10 I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, and my soul shall be joyful in my God: for He hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, and with the robe of justice. He hath covered me, as a bride adorned with her jewels. (T. P. Alleluia, alleluia.) Psalm 29: 2 I will extol Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast upheld me: and hast not made my enemies to rejoice over me. *V. Glory* be to the Father.

COLLECT O God who, by the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin, didst make her a worthy habitation for Thy Son, and didst, by His foreseen death, preserve her from all stain of sin; grant, we beseech Thee, that through her intercession we may be cleansed from sin and come with pure hearts to Thee. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: (Wisdom) Proverbs 8: 22-35 The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived; neither had the fountains of waters as yet sprung out; the mountains with their huge bulk had not as yet been established: before the hills I was brought forth; He had not yet made the earth, nor the rivers, nor the poles of the world. When He prepared the heavens, I was there; when with a certain law and compass He enclosed the depths; when He established the sky above, and poised the fountains of waters; when He compassed the sea with its bounds, and set a law to the waters that they should not pass their limits; when He balanced the foundations of the earth; I was with Him, forming all things, and was delighted every day, playing before Him at all times, playing in the world: and my delight is to be with the children of men. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates, and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.




