## **Pastor's Note**

#### HOLY WEEK 2014

**A**fter so many weeks of preparation we now embark upon the holiest week of the Christian year: "Great Week", as St. Augustine called it. It is helpful for our understanding to follow the course of Christ's Passion according to each day of that week.

**Palm Sunday:** Jesus makes His triumphant messianic entry into the Holy City of Jerusalem to a rapturous welcome by all classes of people. Carried away by their enthusiasm, the crowds want to proclaim Jesus of Nazareth their King, but at that fevered moment, He withdraws from their sight.

**Monday of Holy Week:** Christ comes into the Temple with a whip of rope cords and drives out the buyers and sellers with physical force and righteous wrath. *"It is written, 'My House shall be called a House of Prayer': but you have*  made it a den of thieves." (Matthew 21:13)

**Tuesday of Holy Week:** When Jesus returns to the Temple His enemies are well organized and launch verbal assault after verbal assault on Him while He is trying to give His public teaching. The confrontations end with Jesus pronouncing His eight-fold woe against the Scribes and Pharisees and denouncing Jerusalem for its rejection of Him. Then He leaves the Temple never to return.


**Wednesday of Holy Week:** Judas Iscariot, one of the Twelve Apostles, makes his final arrangements to betray Jesus to His enemies. Hence, this day is called "Spy Wednesday".

**Maundy Thursday:** Jesus shares a meal of the Paschal Lamb with His Apostles, instituting the Eucharist of His Body and Blood. Afterwards He goes to the Garden of Gethsemane where He suffers a great agony of dread. Judas comes with a cohort from the Antonia Fortress's Roman guard and the Jewish Temple-watch to arrest Jesus.

Good Friday: Jesus is first tried and sentenced to death for blasphemy at a religious trial of the Jewish Council during the night. At daybreak, He is taken before the Roman Procurator Pontius Pilate and denounced by the Jewish religious leaders as an insurrectionist. Although Pilate clearly recognized that he was dealing with an innocent man, falsely and maliciously accused, he nonetheless ordered Jesus to be first tortured by scourging, and then he caved in and authorized His crucifixion, just in order to pacify the Jewish religious leaders and the mob they had organized. For three hours Jesus hung on the Cross, from 12 Noon to three o'clock, and then He died. His Body was hastily taken down from the Cross, returned to His relatives and followers and buried in a nearby garden tomb, donated by a member of the Jewish Council, Joseph of Arimathea, who had not consented to what was done to Jesus. All was quiet on Holy Saturday until Jesus' Resurrection before (Fr. Higgins) dawn on Easter Sunday.

GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY Luke 8:4-21

Jesus begins a series of teachings in chapter 8 that center around one central theme: hearing the word of God, and keeping it (cf. 8:21). In vv. 5-8, He tells the familiar parable about a sower scattering seed on different kinds of ground, and the

predictable results. Seeds cast on the path are eaten by birds, seeds cast on rocks sprout up and wither, seeds cast among thorns grow up and are choked. Only the seed cast on good ground produces a crop.

As with all His parables, Jesus communicates deeper truths that elicit the engagement of His listeners, and ideally, an act of faith. If the meaning were entirely plain, it would not cause the listener to think hard on what is being said. On a pedagogical level, Jesus appeals in some fashion to the human enjoyment of solving riddles and puzzles. The obscurity challenges the hearers to seek wisdom and understanding, and thus, to come to Jesus in conversion.

In v. 9, the disciples have seemingly given up on trying to unlock the meaning of the parable, so they ask Jesus to explain it to them. He responds in v. 10, with a reference to Isaiah 6:9-10: "Knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of God has been granted to you; but to the rest, they are made known through parables so that 'they may look but not see, and hear but not understand.'" At first sight, it might seem as if Jesus were building an "in" group, the elite few who "get it," while leaving everyone else to their own devices, but this is not the case. In the first place, the seemingly elite disciples, those closest to Jesus, don't get it. So what does Jesus mean?

The context of the Isaian passage that Jesus quotes refers to the Israelites lack of repentance in Isaiah's day, as the New American Bible notes. What Jesus foretells with this quote is the stark reality that some people will not accept His message and repent, as the Ignatius Study Bible also explains. It is truly a sad reality, for no one could communicate the message of salvation better than Jesus Himself. The apostles faced the same difficulty, as does the Church today. No matter how hard we try to evangelize, or how skilled we are in doing it, there will always be resistance and blockage of some kind in the hearts of people.

In response to their request, Jesus then explains the meaning of the parable plainly in vv. 11-15. Each kind of soil represents a different kind of response to Jesus' word. The path represents those who are closed off to Jesus, and who, when given the opportunity to receive the word, lose it almost instantaneously. The stony ground represents those who receive the word, but fail to nourish their act of faith with the graces of the Church's life of prayer, the sacraments, and the moral life. The thorny ground represents those who receive the word, but fail in their observance of the moral life: the idolatry and undue anxiety for worldly things crowds out any room for the priorities of Christian living. The good soil represents the ideal situation, in which someone hears and receives the word, makes an act of faith, and nourishes faith in the Church, and thereby produces "fruits worthy of repentance" (cf. Luke 3:8). Such a person is like Mary, who "hear[s] the word of God and act[s] on it" (v. 21). Indeed, Mary is truly the good soil Jesus is talking about.

Jesus then encourages "boldness" in His disciples' evangelical efforts, according to St. Augustine's commentary on this passage. Again using a parable (this time, one that is a little more obvious), He compares the good news to a lamp, which no one in their right mind would hide (v. 16). When we light a candle, we depend on it to see *(over)* 

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where we're going, lest we stumble in the dark. So also, the message of the Gospel will go forth and illuminate the world. Jesus then counsels His disciples to be careful in their hearing of His word, alluding to the earlier parable. He cautions us not take it for granted (v. 18). As with the seed sown on different kinds of soil, only the cultivated ground can produce a crop. with 7:36-50 suggests that the sinful woman could have been one of the women who accompanied Jesus and the apostles, indeed, even Mary Magdalene herself. As we continue through Lent, let us imitate St. Mary Magdalene in her penance, material generosity, and joyful accompaniment to the Lord's cross and empty tomb (cf. John 19:25, 20:1-18).

#### PALM SUNDAY

**INTROIT: Psalm 21: 20, 22** O Lord, keep not Thy help far from me: look to my defense: deliver me from the lion's mouth, and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. Psalm 21: 2 O God, my God, look upon me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my sins. Lord, keep not...

COLLECT Almighty and everlasting God, who didst will that our Saviour should take upon Him our flesh and suffer death upon the cross, that all mankind should follow the example of His great humility; mercifully grant that we may both follow the example of His patience and also be made partakers of His resurrection. **EPISTLE: Philippians 2: 5-11** Brethren, let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus: who being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God; but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men, and in habit found as a man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient unto death, even to the death of the cross. For which cause God also hath exalted Him, and hath given Him a name which is above all names: (*Here all genuflect*) that in the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth: and that every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father.

**GRADUAL:** Psalm 72: 24, 1-3 Thou hast held me by my right hand; and by Thy will Thou hast conducted me, and with Thy glory Thou hast received me. V. How good is God to Israel, to those of an upright heart! but my feet were almost moved, my steps had well-nigh slipped: because I was jealous of sinners, seeing the prosperity of sinners. TRACT: Psalm 21:2-9, 18, 19, 22, 24, 32 O God, my God, look upon me; why hast Thou forsaken me? V. Far from my salvation are the words of my sins. V. O my God, I shall cry by day, and Thou wilt not hear; and by night, and it shall not be reputed as folly in me. V. But Thou dwellest in the holy place, the praise of Israel. V. Deliver me from the lion's mouth: and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. V. Ye that fear the Lord, praise Him: all ye the seed of Jacob, glorify Him. V. There shall be declared to the Lord a generation to come; and the heavens shall show forth His justice. V. To a people that shall be born, which the Lord hath made.

And the next day, which followed the day of preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees came together to Pilate, saying: Sir, we have remembered that that seducer said, while He was yet alive: After three days I will rise again. Command therefore the sepulcher to be guarded until the third day, lest perhaps His disciples come and steal Him away and say to the people: He is risen from the dead; and the last error shall be worse than the first. Pilate saith to them: You have a guard; go, guard it as you know. And they departing, made the sepulcher sure, sealing the stone and setting guards.


