




### **Pastor's Note**

#### **THE PAPAL CANONIZATIONS**

Today in Rome is an historic day as Pope Francis canonizes together two of our recent Popes: Pope John XXIII, who reigned from 1958-1963 and convened the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, and Pope John Paul II, whose long reign was from 1978-2005.

Each of these men had strong, charismatic personalities and their papacies—one brief, one very long—were reformist and precedent-breaking. At the same time, they were sons of the Church who continued to uphold the deposit of faith, as every Vicar of Christ is bound to do.

Their reigns (to use the term applied to political leaders nowadays) were “consequential”. Their impact continues to affect the way we live our lives as Catholics today and the way in which the Church relates to the world of today. As a subject of study they will be of continual interest.

They are not being canonized today, however, for their “consequential reigns” nor their policies as popes, as if their canonizations were to put them beyond the reach of critical thinking and analysis (which they do not). They are canonized as saints in heaven on the same terms as the Church makes her judgment on any other person. Did their personal lives manifest faith and moral goodness as permanent dispositions? Have miracles been granted since their death in answer to prayers which the faithful on earth have made to them? Such evidence of miracles-granted after their death is abundantly there. And so we behold an act of the Church’s charism of Infallibility today as these two Holy Popes are raised to the altars.

# KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH

## SCRIPTURE STUDY COLUMN



### GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 8:22-25)

As we read the account of Jesus calming the storm on the Sea of Galilee, it is good for us to remember that the Sea of Galilee is several miles across. Depending on where they were setting out from, Christ and the disciples would have had to travel

at least five miles, and maybe even ten. Thus, it would not have been uncommon for a boat to be caught in a nasty storm on this sea.

As St. Luke unfolds this passage, he shows us a very human moment in Christ's life that should prompt us to remember the humility of our Lord in His Incarnation. In v. 23, we hear that Christ "fell asleep" while they were on their journey. He must have been extremely tired to have fallen asleep in a small boat rocking on the waves. How disarming for us to see the God of the universe submit to the fatigue brought on by the strain of a hard day's work. When we are low-energy, and perhaps feel tempted to be curt or to indulge in some kind of sin, let us entrust our fatigue to the Lord, mindful of our need to rest and regroup, just as He did.

This episode raises the question as to why Christ took them out on the lake at all, if He knew they were headed for a storm. As we read the story,

we see that Christ's purpose was to manifest His divinity through His power over nature. As we go through life, we oftentimes wonder why God lets "squalls" hit us, or why He lets us enter into them. We question how these trials and problems fit into His plan for us. Unfortunately, we cannot always know the answers to these questions this side of heaven.

Sometimes, God gives us glimpses of His plan, or little reminders of his providence. If you experience these, I strongly encourage you to write them down and refer to them as a means of encouragement. Perhaps you are familiar with the Novena to St. Thérèse, after which, as many testify, one usually receives a reminder that one's prayers have been heard by seeing roses, and in some cases, even receiving them. Consolations like these are very heartening. Most of the time, however, God expects us to exercise faith, without consolations of any kind. The faith to which Jesus refers in v. 25 is not an intellectual exercise only, but an act of entrustment to God. One can know mentally that Christ is all powerful, but it is far more profound a thing to *entrust* oneself to Him as our sovereign King in the highs and lows of daily life.

The word that St. Luke uses to describe how Jesus "rebuked the wind and the waves" in v. 24 is the same word he uses in his exorcism accounts, as well as a healing episode (cf. 4:35, 39, 41). It implies complete subjugation and obedience. It is the perfect set-up for the next passage, in which Jesus performs a dramatic exorcism in the territory of the Gerasenes, on the opposite side of the Sea of Galilee. Perhaps Christ led His disciples into a squall, precisely so that He could prepare them for this exorcism, which was more intense than previous exorcisms. Perhaps He desired to bolster their faith in his infinite power over the devil, by showing them his infinite power over the maritime turbulence, which in the Hebrew Biblical tradition was always a metaphor for "chaos and rebellion," as the New American Bible explains. In seeing Christ victorious over the stormy sea and the devil, let us make a more conscious effort to yield the vicissitudes of our lives to our Risen Lord, whose presence in this Season of seasons assures us that He has the last word on evil and death.

**INTROIT:** 1 Peter 2: 2 As newborn babes, alleluia, desire the rational milk without guile, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Psalm 80: 2 Rejoice to God our helper: sing aloud to the God of Jacob. V. Glory be to the Father.

**COLLECT** Grant, we beseech Thee, almighty God, that we who have celebrated the Pascal solemnity, may by Thy bounty show forth its effects in our life and conversation. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** 1 John 5: 4-10 Dearly beloved: Whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory, which overcometh the world, our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God? This is He that came by water and blood, Jesus Christ: not by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit which testifieth that Christ is the truth. And there are three who give testimony in heaven: the Father, the Word and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. And there are three that give testimony on earth: the Spirit and the water and the blood: and these three are one. If we receive the testimony of men the testimony of God is greater: for this is the testimony of God, which is greater, because He hath testified of His Son. He that believeth in the Son of God hath the testimony of God in himself.


**GOSPEL:** John 20: 19-31 **A**t that time, when it was late that same day, the first of the week, and the doors were shut, where the disciples were gathered together for fear of the Jews, Jesus came, and stood in the midst and said to them: Peace be to you. And when He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. The disciples therefore were glad, when they saw the Lord. He said therefore to them again: Peace be to you. As the Father hath sent Me, I also send you. When He had said this, He breathed on them, and He said to them: Receive ye the Holy Ghost: whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them: and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained. Now Thomas, one of the twelve, who is called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said to him: We have seen the Lord. But he said to them: Except I shall see in His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe. And after eight days, again His disciples were within, and Thomas with them. Jesus cometh, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said: Peace be to you. Then He saith to Thomas: Put in thy finger hither, and see My hands, and bring hither thy hand, and put it into my side; and be not faithless, but believing. Thomas answered and said to Him: My Lord and my God. Jesus saith to him: Because thou hast seen Me, Thomas, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and have believed. Many other signs also did Jesus in the sight of His disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written, that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ the Son of God; and that, believing, you may have life in His name.


