

Pastor's Note

ASCENSION THURSDAY MAY 29th, A.D. 2014

The Easter Season is well along now and in the week after next we will have reached the end of the Forty Days, which mark the exact length of time the Lord Jesus appeared to His disciples after His Resurrection. When the Forty Days were done He ascended into Heaven before their very eyes from the Mount of Olives outside Jerusalem. This day is the second great feast-day of the Easter Cycle: the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord.


It is much to be regretted that in recent years many dioceses of the United States have ceased to observe Ascension Thursday, transferring it to the following Sunday. Fortunately, in our own Archdiocese of Boston the proper observance of Ascension Thursday has been retained. It is a Holy Day of obligation and on Ascension Day this year, which falls on May 29th (the Thursday after Memorial Day), we will follow our usual parish Mass schedule for the Holy Days when they fall on a weekday: 7:30 AM, 12:30 PM (Latin Low Mass); 5:30 PM (English Sung Mass), and 7:30 PM (Latin High Mass). Please mark your calendar and plan accordingly! It is all too easy in our secularized culture to lose track of the Church's Holy Days.

Christ's entry into Heaven in His glorified Body means the opening of the gates of Heaven to the redeemed of the human race. Before that, not even the most just and holy souls (think of St. Joseph) could enter into this supernatural eternal life. Even the holy souls of Old Testament times were relegated to the place of the dead, *Sheol*. This is why Christ descended into hell after He died on the Cross and delivered these souls when He rose on Easter morning. On Ascension Day, they were taken up to Heaven in His train.

GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY

(Luke 9:1-6, 10-17)

This week and next week's bulletin columns will not cover the passages of chapter nine in the exact order they are read. Sometimes, St. Luke weaves his account together in such a way that related passages are not always placed next to each other. Thus, this

week I will write about Jesus' commission to the twelve, and their return from their first mission, along with the feeding of the five thousand. Next week, I will write about Herod's opinion about Jesus, which is placed between the sending off of the twelve and their return, and then St. Peter's confession of Jesus, which occurs after the feeding of the five thousand.

Jesus, having taught many things, and having performed many healings and exorcisms, now sends His twelve apostles (the word apostle means "sent") to surrounding towns to announce His coming. He "gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases, and He sent them to proclaim the kingdom of God" (vv. 1-2). This foreshadows the sacrament of holy orders, which, as our Catechism teaches, confers a "sacred power," so that the priest may act "in the person of Christ the head" via the sacraments (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church nos.

1538, 1548).

Jesus recommends that the apostles travel light, so that they may rely upon the hospitality of the people they serve (vv. 3-4). Here, we see the evangelical counsel of poverty most clearly. Such poverty causes them to trust more fully in God's providence. It also gives the people who receive their message an opportunity to demonstrate their conversion through grateful service. This applies to our parish stewardship today. Our material support of the Church's ministers and staff represents our grateful response to God's grace through their ministry and skills. Giving is also a duty of justice in view of the work of those who serve us liturgically, administratively, catechetically, etc..

When the apostles return, Jesus takes them on a retreat. Exhausted from travel and work, they need to recharge by spending time with Jesus. Each of us could use more "down time" with the Lord, no matter our excuse. If we are going to hear His voice, and discern His will, we need to be willing just to be with Him in prayer. We ought not to look at prayer as something we "do" and then check off the list.

The retreat did not last long, however, because the crowds found them, and Jesus "received them...spoke to them...and healed" them (v. 11). This is an extraordinary detail, because it underlines His patience. Then He makes an abundance of food out of the few provisions that are presented to Him: five loaves of bread and two fish. As St. Luke relates, "they all ate and were satisfied" and even had plenty of leftovers, twelve baskets, to be exact (v. 17). This is no small detail, because this account, which is included in all four Gospels, has clear Eucharistic overtones.

Each of the twelve who is charged with caring for Christ's Church, represents the whole order of bishops with St. Peter at the head, leading and feeding the Church on her journey to heaven. In their poverty, Jesus provides abundantly for His apostles, so that they might provide for His people. Nothing has changed in two thousand years. In the words of the third Eucharistic Prayer, "so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to Your name." In other words, at every hour of every day all across the globe, the Church makes the sacrifice of the Cross present again on her altars, and feeds the faithful with the Body of Christ. 
WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"





He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.


