Pastor's Note

THE BLESSED TRINITY AND THE CHURCH FATHERS

All orthodox Christians, including Protestants who consider themselves to be "orthodox" according to their Protestant interpretation of the Sacred Scriptures as against what they consider to be Catholic deviations from the rule of Faith, profess belief in the Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. This Mystery holds that God is a Trinity of Persons in a Unity of Being: three distinct Divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, all co-equal and co-eternal, in one Godhead.

One problem for "Bible Christians" who will only accept what is clearly indicated in texts of Scripture is that the doctrine of the Holy Trinity itself as we know it is not explicitly found there. The dogmatic formulations of the Trinity, as well as the identity of Christ, were the result of the decrees of Church Councils in the first few centuries of the Church, and these in turn relied heavily on the speculative writings of individual learned Christian men who were able to draw out a greater human understanding of these deep spiritual things.

As a group we designate these men as the Church Fathers or simply as the "Fathers". They are the link between the texts of Scripture and the dogmatic statements of the Church's belief. Without them we could not have the structure of Christian belief we take for granted. Strictly speaking, the Fathers are the saintly writers of the first six centuries of the Christian era. More broadly speaking, they stretch out as far as the first twelve centuries. St. Bernard of Clairvaux. +1153 A.D., is considered by Catholics to be the last of the Church Fathers. When there is unanimity or near-unanimity among the Church Fathers on matters of belief, it is considered to be definitive.

Who are included among the Fathers of the Church? St. Ambrose of Milan (340-97), St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430), St. Benedict (480-546), Pope St. Gregory the Great (540-604), St. Jerome (343-420), St. Athanasius (297-373), St. Basil the Great (329-379), St. John Chrysostom (347-407), and St. John Damascene (675-749), to name a few. They are commonly divided into the Latin Fathers and the Greek Fathers which reflected the west-east balance of the Christian world at that time. On this Father's Day Sunday in the USA, how appropriate for us to honor the "Fathers" of the Church, to whom we owe so much.

GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY

(Luke 9:37-43a)

In one of my classes this semester, the professor explained that oftentimes when something marvelous happens in the order of redemption, the devil responds with a mock variant. In other words, when Jesus does something great, or when something wonderful

about God's plan of salvation is revealed, the devil tries to do something to unravel it. The episode of the exorcism at the foot of Mt. Tabor is one such example.

Jesus and three of His disciples come down from the mountain after the transfiguration, and they come upon a dire situation. A man approaches Jesus in desperation concerning his only son, who is demon-possessed. Note that the devil has seized upon the only son of a father immediately after God the Father has affirmed Jesus as His chosen Son. As my professor explained, it is as if the devil, aware that the Passion is approaching, were trying to frighten Jesus with the thought that He will be just as helpless as this poor child during His Passion, and abandoned by the Father. This scene of oppression and anxiety is in stark contrast to the power and serenity of the transfiguration. It likewise mirrors the temptation episode (cf. 4:1-13), in that Satan seeks to introduce doubt concerning Jesus' identity

("if you are the Son of God...").

We should be aware of this tactic of the devil in our lives, too. As we seek to grow stronger in our identity as sons and daughters of God, and live as faithful Catholics, the devil won't leave us alone. Indeed, he will often try to derail our growth in holiness, especially after we have experienced great outpourings of grace. In my family, we call this "Satan's pout." They are specific attacks mocking God's work in our lives.

It is sad that all nine of Jesus' disciples who did not accompany him on Mt. Tabor were unable to cast out the demon, because Jesus had specifically given them the power to do so, as Tannehill has aptly observed in his commentary (cf. 9:1). In St. Matthew's account, the disciples ask Jesus why they couldn't complete the exorcism, and He replies by identifying their lack of faith (cf. Mt. 17:20). In St. Mark's account, Jesus additionally remarks on the necessity of prayer and fasting, which were also lacking in their attempted exorcism (cf. Mk. 9:29). The disciples' lack of faith, prayer, and fasting can help us to understand Jesus' first words in response to the situation: "O faithless and perverse generation, how long will I be with you and endure you?" (v. 41). As then, so also now: our hardness of heart and lack of faith grieve our Lord.

As each of us confronts the demonic temptations that assail us, it is worth remembering that prayer and penance are not confined to Lent. While Eastertide and Pentecost are appropriately times of feasting and rejoicing, we still need to fortify ourselves against the devil by developing a consistent and realistic regimen of daily prayer, by fasting, and by practicing acts of self-denial, all of which help to uproot sin.

When Jesus exorcises the demon and heals the boy, St. Luke tells us that "all were astonished by the majesty of God" (v. 43). This is fitting, since Jesus' majesty, while resplendent in His transfiguration, is also fully operative in His confrontation with the devil. Indeed, Jesus reveals His glory by meeting the devil head on, and bringing his work to nought. Similarly, the more we allow God's grace into our lives by prayer, fasting, confession, and the reception of Holy Communion, we will experience divine power at work in us, healing us, and helping us to resist temptation and to uproot sin. 
WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"




