# CONFIRMATION: THE SACRAMENT FOR MARTYRDOM

This Sunday at our 5:30 PM parish Mass His Excellency Most Rev. Arthur Kennedy, auxiliary bishop of Boston and director for the Office of New Evangelization, will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 18 young men and women. We congratulate the *Confirmandi* and their families on this joyous occasion, for they are now fully initiated Christians.

The three Sacraments of Christian Initiation are Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. With Confirmation, a Christian receives a special infusion of God's Holy Spirit which leaves its own distinct, permanent character on the soul. For this reason Confirmation, like Baptism, is a once-only occasion in a person's life. It cannot be repeated.

With the graces of Confirmation, the Christian soul receives enhanced strength from God to be a faithful witness to Christ in the world. A familiar phrase surrounding Confirmation is to become "a soldier of Christ".

We ought to be very, clear, however, that the grace of witness we are talking about is the grace to be better able to suffer for the Name of Christ and to be ready even to shed our life-blood, if that should be necessary, in order to remain faithful to Christ and the vows of our own Baptism.

In our own secularized USA there is a certain amount of disdain and incomprehension we have to forbear as Christians. It is not at all inconceivable in the near-future that the aggression of the state could push faithful Catholics into a de-facto second-class citizenship for not going along with what we believe to be immoral laws or bureaucratic orders.

But this can hardly be compared to the physical suffering and threats to life which many Christians in the world are experiencing today. Recently a Sudanese Christian woman now living in Manchester, New Hampshire, gave an interview to local media about her escape from death for the "crime" of being of a Christian in her home country. Her name is Meriam Ibrahim. Her father was a Muslim, her mother an Orthodox Christian. She married Daniel Wani, a Christian from Southern Sudan in 2011. For this, she was arrested, imprisoned, and sentenced to capital punishment for "apostasy". As the daughter of a Muslim father she was not allowed not to be Muslim. Islamic law punishes conversion to any other religion by death. She was subjected to a group of imams coming to her in prison to brow-beat her into renouncing her Christianity and her marriage to a Christian. She was pregnant with her daughter and gave birth to her in prison, with her shackled in chains. "I had my trust in God," she said. "My faith was the only weapon I had."

Fortunately for her, she was eventually released and sought refuge in the US embassy. But as she herself recognizes: "There are many Meriams in Sudan and throughout the world."

## **KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH**





#### GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 12:22-34)

**H**aving just taught the parable of the rich fool, Iesus instructs His disciples about the virtue of trust. "Do not worry," He says, about the daily necessities, because "life is more than food and the body more than clothing (vv. 22-23). He identifies the futility of worry with

straightforward questions: "Can any of you by worrying add a moment to your life-span? If even the smallest things are beyond your control, why are you anxious about the rest?" (vv. 25-26). This teaching follows well upon the previous parable about the rich fool enslaved by materialism. Whether we are wealthy or poor, the message remains the same: do not be overcome with worry about material things, because worrying cannot solve our problems or gain us happiness.

This Gospel is not a naive moralism about simply trying harder to relax (such advice is usually unhelpful). Rather, Jesus is teaching us to be keenly conscious of God's providential care for us, such that we go about our work and responsibilities with a serene and prayerful spirit. This protects us from wasting mental and emotional energy on things we cannot ultimately control. The "Serenity Prayer" can prove helpful here: "God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and wisdom to know the difference. Amen."

Jesus also gives us an analogy from nature: "Notice the ravens: they do not sow or reap; they have neither storehouse nor barn, yet God feeds them. How much more important are you than birds!" (v. 24). Generally speaking, and as most dog owners can testify, a dog's nature tends towards trusting man and looking to him with complete abandonment for its well-being. Most everyone finds this highly endearing. What we find to be endearing about animals provides a lesson for us. Would that we could have an analogous kind of complete abandonment to God's love and care. Imagine God's pleasure when we make resolute acts of faith, hope, and love throughout our day.

Fundamentally, Jesus' teaching about worry is about worship and idolatry. Jesus equates human worry with the behavior of pagan Gentiles (v. 30). Pagans often had servile fear for their gods, obsessively worrying about placating them so as to obtain favors. Worry is a form of pagan idolatry, because it manifests a lack of trust that God is really God, and thus, that He will provide for man. In contrast, Jesus commands us to "seek His kingdom" (v. 31). In other words, we need to observe the First Commandment (loving and adoring God above all). Abiding in the reality of his loving sovereignty can help to dissipate our excessive worry.

Jesus also tells us not to be afraid, because God "is pleased to give [us] the kingdom" (v. 32). The most important thing we need (God's very life and friendship) is the very thing our Lord is most eager to give! In fact, Jesus assures us that our level of worry can be so low, that we can "sell [our] belongings and give alms" (v. 33). Jesus calls us to be detached from our possessions. This is not reckless, nor imprudent. It is a practical and simple solution for worrying-dare we try it? As Jesus explains in vv. 33-34, almsgiving is "an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Every material possession of ours will turn into dust. With what will we stand before God at our judgment? A generous heart



#### MASS OF CONFIRMATION

FIRST READING: (Isaiah 61:1ff) The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the lowly, to heal the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and release to the prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the LORD and a day of vindication by our God, to comfort all who mourn; to place on those who mourn in Zion a diadem instead of ashes, to give them oil of gladness in place of mourning, a glorious mantle instead of a listless spirit. You yourselves shall be named priests of the LORD, ministers of our God you shall be called. I will give them their recompense faithfully, a lasting covenant I will make with them. Their descendants shall be renowned among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see shall acknowledge them as a race the LORD has blessed.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

SECOND READING: (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-6ff) **29** hen the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed to them: "You who are Jews, indeed all of you staying in Jerusalem. Let this be known to you, and listen to my words. Jesus the Nazorean was a man commended to you by God with mighty deeds, wonders, and signs, which God worked through Him in your midst, as you yourselves know. This man, delivered up by the set plan and foreknowledge of God, you killed, using lawless men to crucify Him. God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses. Exalted at the right hand of God, He received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father and poured it forth, as you both see and hear."

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia. Alleluia. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of Your love.

GOSPEL: (Luke 4:16-22a) **J**esus came to Nazareth, where He had grown up, and went according to His custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Jesus unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: "The Spirit of the LORD is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the LORD." Rolling up the scroll, He handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at Him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." And all spoke highly of Him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from His mouth.






