



SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 21: 1-4

This week, our study begins a new chapter in St. Luke's Gospel (Ch. 21). In reality, the chapter marker is irrelevant, for St. Luke is reporting events that occurred in the same locale and (most likely) on the same day. The chapter and verse designations were not part of the original manuscripts, but

were imposed by editors in subsequent centuries. On the one hand, this system can help us find certain passages, or commit them to memory. On the other hand, the chapter and verse designations sometimes artificially divide passages that are intended to be read as a continuous unit, such as the teachings and confrontation scenes of Chapters 20 and 21.

Having just condemned the hypocrisy, greed, and cruelty of the scribes toward widows at the end of Chapter 20, Jesus turns His attention to a humble widow offering two coins in the Temple treasury. St. Luke intentionally juxtaposes this scene in 21:1-4 with Jesus' condemnation of the scribes in 20:46-47 in order to highlight the widow's virtue, as Robert Tannehill explains in his commentary on St. Luke's Gospel. Here is the account of the episode in full: "When He looked up He saw some wealthy people putting their offerings into the treasury and He noticed a poor widow putting in two small coins. He said, 'I tell you truly, this poor widow put in more than all the rest; for those others have all made offerings from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has offered her whole livelihood." For Jesus to notice this widow at all reinforces His loathing of the scribe's vain and hypocritical religiosity. Indeed, Jesus shows us that exemplary tithing is about sacrifice, not show. The widow gave well beyond the expected 10% of the Mosaic Law. She gave of her substance!

The message in this simple passage can be challenging when viewed in light of contemporary American tithing practices. Generally speaking, American Catholics could stand to contribute more of their gross income to the Church and the needs of the poor. The weekly tithe should not be an occasion where we give God what is "left over," after we have calculated or made all our other expenses. The consistent teaching of Scripture is that God is owed the first fruits of our labor. Everything we have comes from God, including the income we have earned by our skills, time, and effort. Indeed, our skill, time, and effort are fundamentally His gifts to us, also. Thus, He has ultimate claim on everything in our lives, even before the IRS. Jesus commends the superior quality of the widow's offering, because it demonstrates her acknowledgement of the primacy of God's reign in her life.

Conjoined to this reality about stewardship is the equally important truth that God desires our gifts to be given to him with a "cheerful" attitude, and not under "compulsion," as St. Paul teaches us (cf. 2 Corinthians 9:7). In other words, our sacrifices should be characterized primarily by an attitude of joyful thanksgiving. Such an attitude helps to relieve us of anxieties about money. Even as God gives us the responsibility of being good and prudent stewards of our assets, He expects us to keep first things first. The regular act of submitting our finances to God can actually infuse great joy into our lives, for it reminds us that God is ultimately in control. He cares far more deeply for our temporal needs than we do (cf. Luke 12:22-34)! In this month of the Precious Blood, as we meditate on Jesus' total self-gift to us, let us strive to improve the quality of our offerings to him and to our parish.






