SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 21: 5-38

ftost of the 21st Chapter of St. Luke's Gospel is devoted to Jesus' teachings on two separate events: the fall of Jerusalem on the one hand, and the Second Coming, on the other. Jesus' lengthy discourse is prompted by comments of the crowd regarding the beauty and splendor of the Jerusalem Temple (v. 5).

This is an interesting juxtaposition with the immediately preceding episode, in which Jesus commends the seemingly insignificant but spiritually rich offering of the widow (vv. 1-4). In response to the people's comments on the Temple's "costly" trappings, Jesus calls their attention to its impermanence, and He foretells its utter destruction as an event that will occur in their lifetime: "All that you see here- the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down" (v. 6). The Roman general Titus besieged Jerusalem and looted its Temple in 70 A.D..

Jesus also foretells the rise of false messiahs (linking this phenomenon with the general timeframe of the Temple's destruction) and He strictly warns the people not to follow them (v. 8). This reiterates His earlier teaching in 17:22-23. Jesus then comments upon events that will precede His Second Coming: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky" (vv. 10-11).

Before all of these cataclysmic events that will precede the end of the world, however, Jesus foretells the suffering of His followers, and particularly those in the first generation of the Church. They certainly apply to all eras of persecution. As He explains, "...they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony" (vv. 12-13). Indeed, the Book of Acts directly fulfills this prophecy, and it is likely that St. Luke has the plan of this book in mind as he records Jesus' teaching. St. Luke was an eye-witness of some of St. Paul's sufferings, and even experienced some of the same hardships alongside him.

Jesus then reiterates four instructions given earlier in chapters 12-13. Firstly, He promises to endow His disciples with unassailable wisdom in giving verbal testimony to Him (v. 15). Secondly, He foretells that His followers will experience persecution and betrayal *even by their own families and friends* (v. 16). Thirdly, He elicits their complete trust by assuring them of His providential protection in figurative terms- "not a hair on your head will be destroyed" (v. 18). Fourthly, He exhorts them to persevere nonetheless in their suffering, because such perseverance has eternal consequences (v. 19). Again, one sees all of these things unfold in the Book of Acts.

Jesus again treats the subject of the siege of Jerusalem, "*surrounded by armies*" (vv. 20-24), and then shifts to the subject of his Second Coming, preceded by cosmic signs of woe (vv. 25-26). The most stirring verse of the whole chapter is v. 27: "*And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory*." Jesus refers here to Daniel's prophetic vision of the Messiah, clearly identifying himself as this figure (cf. Dan. 7:13-14).

Ultimately, amid whatever chaos the world endures, the Church's gaze must be fixed on her Risen Lord, for he alone will outlast the turmoil: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (v. 33). Keeping our inward gaze fixed on Jesus means practicing vigilance in our prayers, thoughts, and conduct, as Jesus himself exhorts us at the end of his discourse in vv. 34-36: "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap...Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

Jesus' exhortation here anticipates His words to the disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane (cf. 22:40, 46). As we pray the mystery of Jesus' Agony in the Garden in the Holy Rosary, let us pray for an

Therefore calling together every one of his master's debtors, he said to the first: 'How much dost thou owe my lord?' But he said: 'A hundred barrels of oil.' And he said to him: 'Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty.' Then he said to another: 'And how much dost thou owe?' Who said: 'A hundred parters of wheat.' He said to him: 'Take thy bill, and write eighty.' And the lord commended the unjust steward, for as much as he had done wisely: for the children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light. And I say unto you: Make unto yourselves friends of the mammon of iniquity, that when you fail, they may receive you into everlasting dwellings."
