




SOLEMN MASS OF THANKSGIVING for FATHER JUAN CARLOS RIVERA CASTRO, S.J.

Pastor's Note

PARISH LIFE

3 want to use the Pastor's Note this week to convey some various pieces of information affecting our Parish Life:

First, a reminder that next Sunday we will be celebrating a Mass of Thanksgiving of yet another newly-ordained priest (our third within the last thirty days), Father Juan Carlos Rivera,



ordained a priest for the Society of Jesus on June 11th. Fr. Juan Carlos will take up his first assignment at St. Francis Church in St. Louis at the beginning of August. In the interim he will be giving us his priestly assistance here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes for the month of July, an accommodation for which we are most grateful. So, we will be enjoying the blessings of his new-priest's ministry for a few weeks this summer.

Secondly, next Sunday we will also be welcoming back Fr. Desire Salako, S.M.A., to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes for the summer months. Fr. Salako has a mission parish in northern Liberia, an area which was devastated by the Ebola plague two years ago. The support our parish gives him for his service to us for two months, together with a special collection we will take up for him at the end of his stay, enables him to bring back desperately needed resources to his mission in Liberia.





In other news:

The care of our parish buildings and grounds is the charge of our parish sacristans. In recent weeks Angelus Davulis has agreed to assume the responsibilities of First Sacristan, a position left vacant when Manny Goguen left a few months ago. During the summer Angelus will be assisted during the work-week by Earl Smith and Peter Goguen. Francis Gallagher continues to serve as our Sacristan on Saturday/Sunday.

Our retired superintendent for St. Mary's Cemetery Sean Ward, who had continued working part-time as the Sexton for the church for several years after his retirement, has relocated near his daughter Noreen in New Hampshire.

The final sale of the St. Elizabeth Center continues to hover, despite the City of Newton's approval of the parking requirement waver we needed in order to subdivide the property. It is a frustrating delay, but at least the happy resolution of the matter in a mutually satisfactory real-estate transaction between the seller and buyer seems to be in sight. I will report further when it is accomplished.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST 1 Peter 3:8-15

♣t. Peter's words today remind us of the importance of charity and right conduct among believers. A charge commonly leveled against the Church by unbelievers is that it is full of hypocrites. While there is some truth in this accusation (we do well to be conscious of our own failings against the commandments), it is also true of every other institution. Wherever human beings are, there exist hypocrisy and selfishness in greater or lesser degrees. Those who accuse the Church oftentimes and ironically fail to recognize their own hypocrisy. What unbelievers also fail to realize is that Christians seek the grace of the sacraments, precisely because they are aware of their sinfulness and their need for grace, so as to become virtuous and holy.

Thus, on the one hand, we should in some measure expect the Church to manifest some of the same ailments of the world, for it is filled with sinful human beings. On the other hand, we should also expect to see great holiness and virtue, and indeed, we do see it, if our eyes and hearts are open. This is in great contrast to the tenor of the world, because the *Church* is *Holy*, as we profess in the Creed. She is Christ's own Bride and Body, and He has filled her with the fullness of His grace. She is both a divine and a human institution (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos. 770-776, 792-796, 823-829). We must believe these truths with divine and Catholic faith whenever we profess the Creed. We must not pray the Creed with our fingers crossed behind our back!

Today's Epistle manifests the ideal to which we, as members of the Church Militant, are striving. It is not pie-in-the-sky moralism. Rather, it is eminently practical. God does not call His children to obey the commandments without giving the necessary grace to do so. The characteristics of "unity of spirit, sympathy, love of the brethren, a tender heart and a humble mind" (v. 8, RSV) are all gifts of grace that believers can acquire more and more in their life of discipleship. Fittingly, our Collect for today explicitly requests from God an infusion of His love

in order to observe the Great Commandment, i.e., the two-fold love of God and neighbor (cf. Mt. 22:37-40). We pray the following: "Pour into our hearts the affection [or devotion] of Your love, so that loving You in all things and above all things, we may obtain your promises, etc." Loving God above all things and in all things is another way of phrasing Jesus' "Summary of the Law."

A large portion of today's passage is a quotation drawn from Ps. 34. It is worth noting that the Book of Psalms is one of the most frequently quoted Old Testament books in the New Testament. This should tell us something about the prominent place it should take in our public and private prayer. The Church has always treasured and made use of the Psalms in her worship, especially the Divine Office. One of the many strong points of the Psalms is the embedding of moral instruction within prayer. Such is today's quotation from Ps. 34:12-16, which St. Peter uses to justify his moral exhortation. In praying Scripture, we welcome the wholesome truths of right living into our hearts and minds, assimilating them into the formation of our conscience. More than any other book in Scripture, the Psalms contain many portions of text which can be memorized over time through repeated use in prayer.

The final verses in today's passage can provide encouragement for us who live in a culture that, generally speaking, does not respect religion or Biblically-based morality, and is often hostile thereto. In v. 14, St. Peter teaches his flock what his successor St. John Paul II taught us so many times, "Be not afraid." The natural next question is how exactly we are to do this. St. Peter tells us in v. 15: "in your hearts reverence Christ as Lord" (RSV). We usually do not feel very calm in the midst of carrying our cross. We can, however, cling firmly to the certainty of Jesus' kingship over the world, and His reign in our hearts. We can make acts of faith, hope, and love. Indeed, daily submission to Jesus' rule as King and Lord in our hearts within the circumstances of life is the way to "reverence [Him] as Lord," and so remain faithful disciples.

For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile. Let him decline from evil and do good; let him seek after peace, and pursue it; because the eyes of the Lord are upon the just, and His ears unto their prayers, but the countenance of the Lord is against them that do evil things. And who is he that can hurt you, if you be zealous of good? But if also you suffer anything for justice' sake, blessed are ye. And be not afraid of their fear, and be not troubled; but sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts.




