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SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: PRESENTATION OF THE LORD, FEBRUARY 5th, A.D. 2017

∬ or this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, which is identical in both forms of the Roman Rite. Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010):

"Almighty ever-living God, we humbly implore Your majesty that, just as Your Only Begotten Son was presented on this day in the Temple in the substance of our flesh, so, by Your grace, we may be presented to You with minds made pure. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. Almighty ever-living God (address),

2. [whose] Only Begotten Son was presented on this day in the Temple in the substance of our flesh (dual function as acclamation and motive for the petition), 3. we humbly implore Your majesty, that we may be presented to You with minds made pure (petition), 4. by Your grace (motive for the petition),

5. Through our Lord, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If Christ, who shares in our humanity, was presented to the Father in the Jerusalem Temple,
- B) And if we are joined by grace to the Body of Christ, the true Temple.
- C) Then we too may be presented to the Father with minds made pure.

This Collect draws a parallel between Christ and the members of his Body, the Church, who collectively offer this prayer: Christ being presented in the Temple in the substance of our flesh corresponds to the Church being presented to God with minds made pure. This Collect, therefore, leads us to reflect on the Sacred Humanity of Christ as the saving "*instrument*" for human salvation (cf. *Catechism* nos. 461, 515, 609). In Baptism, we are incorporated into Christ's Mystical Body, our sins are forgiven, and we are given a permanent "*character*" that is ordered to "*Divine worship*." In Christ, and by his grace, we are made worthy to offer worship to the Father, i.e, to be presented to Him with minds made pure (cf. *Catechism* nos. 1213, 1265, 1267-1268; cf. Thomas Aquinas, *ST* III q. 63, a. 1; q. 69, aa. 1, 2, 4, 7, 9).

In reference to this feast, therefore, the Collect's petition hinges upon our grace-effected union with Christ who, as the Divine Son, offers true worship to the Father. Scripture and Tradition testify that Christ's Body, at one time presented in the Jerusalem Temple, is now the true Temple through which we may be purified by the action of sacramental grace. Joined to His Body, we are made fit to appear before the Father and to worship Him "in spirit and truth" (cf. Jn. 2:19-22, 4:23-24, RSV).

In his excellent book, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*, then-Cardinal Ratzinger offers a particularly clear and compelling exposition of this teaching (it certainly informs my summary above). On p. 43, he summarizes the import of Christ's words in John 2: "[Christ] shows that the destruction of his earthly body will be at the same time the end of the Temple. With his Resurrection the new Temple will begin: the living body of Jesus Christ, which will now stand in the sight of God and be the place of all worship. Into this body He incorporates men....[in the Eucharist] Christ communicates Himself to us and thus brings us into a real bond with the living God."



BRETHREN: Put ye on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, the depths of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty, patience: bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if any have a complaint against another: even as the Lord hath forgiven you, so do you also. But above all these things have charity, which is the bond of perfection: and let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts, wherein also you are called in one body: and be ye thankful. 


