

# **LENT IN THE PARISH**

#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Abstinence from Flesh Meat: obliges beginning on a person's 14th birthday and applies to Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
- 2. Practice of Penance: all Catholics should perform some act of penance on the weekdays of Lent (for example, our personal Lenten sacrifices), and Fridays throughout the year (for example, not eating meat on Friday).
- 3. Days of Fast: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. On these 2 days of the year all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to fast according to the guideline of 1 full-meal permitted and 2 smaller meals allowed to maintain strength.



Any person is free to observe the more stringent laws of abstinence, penance and fast in place before 1965 for himself, provided he understands that he cannot impose that same strictness on others.

Our Conferences over these next few Fridays in Lent will recount the history of this Order and consider several spiritual themes which their history brings out for us.

## **SCRIPTURE STUDY**

#### THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: SAINT JOSEPH MARCH 5th, A.D. 2017

Jor the next three weeks in our meditations on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we will consider the Collects for the Feast of St. Joseph (celebrated on March 19) according to the MR 1970. These three columns are adapted from material that I originally wrote for an exam at St. John's Seminary in May 2016. Below is the official ICEL translation of the day's principal Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010):

"Grant, we pray, almighty God, that by St. Joseph's intercession your Church may constantly watch over the unfolding of the mysteries of human salvation, whose beginnings you entrusted to his faithful care. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

- 1. Almighty God (address),
- 2. [You] entrusted the beginnings of the mysteries of human salvation to the faithful care of St. Joseph (ascription of God),
- 3. grant, we pray, that Your Church may constantly watch over the unfolding of these same mysteries (petition),
- 4. by St. Joseph's intercession, (motive for petition),
- 5. Through our Lord, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If God has entrusted the Church with watching over the mysteries of salvation, which at one time were entrusted to St. Joseph,
- B) And if St. Joseph intercedes for the Church,
- C) Then God will enable the Church faithfully to fulfill the same office of St. Joseph in watching over the mysteries of salvation.

There exists a strong correspondence in this Collect between St. Joseph and the Church in terms of a shared office: St. Joseph and the Church exercise the same office of *custos*, or guardian of Christ, albeit at difference stages and in different ways. God entrusted Jesus Himself, *the* mystery of human salvation, to the faithful care, protection, or guardianship (*fideli custodiae*) of St. Joseph at the very beginning of the plan of salvation (Bethlehem, Egypt, Nazareth). To the Church, God has entrusted the office of watching over (*servet*) the further development of this mystery, that is, Christ Himself in his sacramental economy.

The Collect does not stop at this comparison, however, but presents St. Joseph as exercising the role of *custos* in perpetuity by means of his intercession for the Church, who, at this stage in salvation history, is the immediate *custos* or guardian of the mystery. Herein, we may discern how the Collect links the Church to Christ and Our Lady. St. Paul speaks of the Church as the Body of Christ (cf. 1 Cor. 12:12-27). Tradition has long spoken of Our Lady as the archetype of the Church (cf. *Catechism of* the Catholic Church nos. 507, 2679). By linking Christ and Our Lady to the Church, therefore, we necessarily expand St. Joseph's care for them to his care for the Church. St. Joseph's intercession for the Church as its heavenly custos may be securely likened to his earthly role as custos for Our Lord and Our Lady. Think of his love for Jesus and Mary, and his holy prayers in their behalf! What joy and comfort, therefore, ought we to take in his loving prayers for us! Who better for the Church to rely on for the success of her divine mission? Thanks be to God! power of his prayers.



#### LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

INTROIT: Psalm 90: 15-16 He shall cry to me, and I will hear him: I will deliver him, and I will glorify him: I will fill him with length of days. *Psalm* 90:1 He that dwelleth in the aid of the Most High shall abide under the protection of the God of Heaven. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, who dost purify Thy Church by the yearly observance of forty days; grant to Thy household that what we strive to obtain from Thee by self denial, we may secure by good works. Through our Lord. EPISTLE: 2 Corinthians 6: 1-10 Brethren: We exhort you that you receive not the grace of God in vain. For He saith: In an accepted time have I heard thee, and in the day of salvation have I helped thee. Behold, now is the acceptable time, behold now is the day of salvation. Giving no offence to any man that our ministry be not blamed: but in all things let us exhibit ourselves as the ministers of God, in much patience, in tribulation, in necessities, in distresses, in stripes, in prisons, in seditions, in labours, in watchings, in fastings, in chastity, in knowledge, in longsuffering, in sweetness, in the Holy Ghost, in charity unfeigned, in the word of truth, in the power of God: by the armour of justice on the right hand and on the left: by honour and dishonour, by evil report and good report: as deceivers and yet true, as unknown and yet known: as dying, and behold we live: as chastised and not killed: as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing: as needy, yet enriching many: as having nothing and possessing all things.




