

SEVEN GOOD HABITS OF PARISH STEWARDSHIP

As I announced here in last Sunday's bulletin: the place of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes in the archdiocesan reconfiguration plan is officially a "stand-alone" parish. We will not be joined to another parish in a collaborative when the eleventh and final phase of the plan is implemented in 2023. Instead, we will be able to continue as we have been since Mary Immaculate of Lourdes was declared a "mission parish" with a special apostolate to the traditional Latin Mass in 2007. Cardinal Seán has seen fit to confirm his earlier pastoral plan for us within the structure of the current archdiocesan-wide "Disciples in Mission" plan.

This is, to say the least, most welcome news for our parish community. We can continue to build on the last ten years in the knowledge that we have a sufficient stability. There is no reason outside of ourselves why our parish cannot survive and thrive in the years to come. Whether this next decade of our parish life is indeed one of a deepening of Christian faith-life for the community depends crucially on the sense of stewardship coming from you the lay-faithful. If there is enough commitment and financial support then we will have merited the Cardinal's favorable decision to let us have this status of a "stand-alone" parish.

Here follows a list of "Seven Good Habits of Stewardship" which will help us focus on the task at hand.

- 1. Realize that the primary purpose of any parish is for the Glory of God and the Sanctification of Souls.
- 2. Choose a parish community to belong to and commit to it. ((Every Catholic should be officially registered in one parish, and one parish only, at a time: we have the freedom now to choose our parish and are not restricted to the territorial parish in which we happen to live. It is poor stewardship to enroll in a parish and then not also commit to being part of its Sunday worship on a regular basis.)
- 3. Support our parish at a "stewardship level" of giving. (Make a conscientious commitment to give a certain percentage of our gross household income each year as a direct gift to the parish for its support. Giving between 5-10% of gross household income shows a real commitment to stewardship level giving.)
- 4. Church support is our gift given to God in gratitude for His blessings to us.
- 5. God gets paid with "first fruits", not with what we happen to have left over.
- 6. We should imitate God in His munificence: we should always be thinking about how we can do more for God's Church.
- 7. The duty of Church-support is lifelong. (As long as we have a dollar to our name—the Lord should always gets His portion from us.)

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: JUNE 25th, A.D. 2017 VIGIL MASS FOR SS. PETER & PAUL

J or this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Vigil Mass of the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, said on June 28 (MR 1962). In the Pauline Reform (MR 1970), this Collect is used for the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter. Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010):

"Grant, we pray, almighty God, that no tempests may disturb us, for you have set us fast on the rock of the Apostle Peter's confession of faith. Through our Lord, etc. Amen." Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

- 1. Almighty God (address),
- 2. You, who have set us fast on the rock of the Apostle Peter's confession of faith (ascription),
- 3. grant that no tempests may disturb us (petition),
- 4. n/a (perhaps a motive clause may be implied, e.g., "we, who confess the faith of St. Peter"),
- 5. Through our Lord, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If God has established his Church on the rock of Peter's confession of faith,
- B) And if we (the Church) continue to confess the faith of Peter regarding Christ,
- C) Then God will not ot allow us to be done-in by the confusion/disturbances of the Adversary.

If we were to re-translate this Collect with the use of several synonyms for three key Latin words [these are drawn from Stelton's Dictionary of Ecclesiastical Latin], it would look like this:

"Grant, we beseech you, almighty God, that You would permit -no tempest/disturbance/confusion/disorder/trouble -to strike/alarm/cause to tremble

us. whom You have

-established/founded/strengthened/made firm on the rock of the apostolic confession."

This prayer evokes Lk. 22:31-32, wherein Christ prays for Peter, that his "faith may not fail," even though Satan will seek to "sift" all the apostles "like wheat." Our Collect recognizes God's permissive will regarding the devil's activity, and the need for divine protection, which may be had on the "rock of the apostolic confession," i.e., both the faith of Peter and the faith of the Church.

Jesus founds his Church on the person of Peter in Mt. 16, calling him "Rock" (v. 18). The rock in this passage is also Peter's confession of Christ's divinity, as our Collect notes. In the same verse, Jesus promises that "the gates of Hades shall not prevail against" his Church. To borrow from our Collect, Christ's promise may be interpreted thus: the Adversary will not be able to strike, alarm, or shake the Church with a definitively fatal tempest, disturbance, confusion, disorder, or trouble. While the Church does experience these attacks in many forms, [and suffers greatly from them in many cases], nevertheless they are not fatal for the whole, nor for Peter in particular. Thus, in our Collect, we are asking God for the on-going fulfillment of Christ's promise to Peter and the Church.

In view of this, our Collect leads us to consider Peter's own exhortation to the first eneration of Christians in his First Epistle: "Be sober, be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking some one to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith" (1 Pet. 5:8-9, RSV). The Maronites, faithful Eastern Catholics descended from Peter's ministry in Antioch, joyfully proclaim the following on the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Our faith is the faith of Peter; the faith of Peter is our faith!" On this great Feast, let us be firm in this faith, and rejoice that God has established us on the "rock of the apostolic confession."






Fr. Haddad's is celebrating his first Mass for the Mission this Saturday, June 24th, at 5:30 PM.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

INTROIT: *Psalm 32. 11, 19* The thoughts of His Heart are from generation to generation: To deliver their souls from death and feed them in famine. Ps. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just, praise becometh the upright. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT: O God, Who in the Heart of Thy Son, wounded by our sins, dost mercifully vouchsafe to bestow upon us the infinite wealth of Thy love; grant, we beseech Thee, that revering It with meet devotion, we may fulfil our duty of worthy reparation. Through the same our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Ephesians 3.8-19* Brethren: To me, the least of all the Saints, is given the grace, to preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ: and to enlighten all men, that they may see what is the dispensation of the mystery which hath been hidden from eternity in God, Who created all things: that the manifold wisdom of God may be made known to the principalities and powers in heavenly places through the Church, according to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord: in Whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of Him. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom all paternity in Heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man, that Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts: that being rooted and grounded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the Saints, what is the breadth and length, and height and depth: to know also the charity of Christ which surpasseth all knowledge. That you may be filled unto all the fullness of God.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 24. 8,9* The Lord is sweet and righteous: therefore He will give a law to sinners in the way. V. He will guide the mild in judgment: He will teach the meek His ways. ALLELUIA: *Matthew 11. 29* Alleluia, alleluia. V. Take My yoke upon you and learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of heart: and you shall find rest to your souls. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *John 19. 31-37* At that time: The Jews (because it was the Parasceve), that the bodies might not remain on the cross on the Sabbath day (for that was a great Sabbath day), besought Pilate that their legs might be broken: and that they might be taken away. The soldiers therefore came: and they broke the legs of the first, and of the other that was crucified with him. But after they were come to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers, with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water. And he knoweth that saw it, hath given testimony: and his testimony is true. And he knoweth that he saith true, that you may believe. For these things were done that the Scripture might be fulfilled: You shall not break a bone of Him. And again another Scripture saith: They shall look on Him Whom they pierced.

OFFERTORY: *Psalm* 68. 21 My Heart hath expected reproach and misery: and I looked for one that would grieve together with Me, but there was none: and for one that would comfort Me, and I found none.

SECRET: Look, we beseech Thee, O Lord, upon the ineffable love of the Heart of Thy beloved Son; that our offering may be acceptable unto Thee and atone for all our sins. Through the same our Lord.

COMMUNION: John 19.34 One of the soldiers with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water.

POSTCOMMUNION: May Thy holy mysteries, O Lord Jesus, produce in us a divine fervour, whereby, having tasted the sweetness of Thy most dear Heart, we may learn to despise earthly things and love those of heaven: Who livest and reigneth.






