JULY IS THE MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

Pastor's Note



WELCOME BACK, FATHER SALAKO

∌e are very happy to welcome back Fr. Desiré Salako, of the

Society of African Missions Fathers (S.M.A.) for the months of July and August. This is Father's third summer with us at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes.



Since he left us last September he has assumed the office of Father Provincial for the S.M.A. Province of Benin-Niger. Responsible for 75 S.M.A. priests and the mission-posts they staff, Fr. Salako has spent much of the past year traveling to these various missions.

The most difficult field of mission in his area of responsibility is that of Niger—one of the world's poorest countries, with a population 95% Muslim and 2.5% Catholic. There are twelve S.M.A. missions in Niger at present.

The country has been under a 3 year drought. This year the rains returned at last, but, due to the extremely parched earth, the heavy rains caused flooding, mudslides, and destruction of many houses which are made from dried mud.

The pictures below show some of the effects of this flooding:







The most serious consequence, however, is that the rains prevented people from sowing their crops at seed-time. This means that the population will be faced with famine this year without the help of international aid organizations.

Besides the poverty and the extreme-climate conditions there is the menace of the world-wide jihad. Over the past decade or so money from the Arab Gulf States has contributed to the radicalization of the Muslim populations in Africa. In the aftermath of the Charlie Hebdo murders in Paris, January 2015, the consequences of this radicalization were felt by the Christians in Niger. The President of Niger, a Muslim himself, went to Paris to join world leaders who marched in solidarity against this terrorist act. Fanatical imams incited people, claiming that the President was taking the side of infidels against the Muslims. Mobs attacked







Christian churches and schools, burning them. Many Christians were killed. The photographs here are of the ruins of the parish of Ste. Thérèse de L'Enfant Jesus in the capital city, two years now after these events. (Note how the large Sanctuary Cross, though charred, was not consumed by the flames.)

All the work of so many years was destroyed in a few hours. Yet the S.M.A Fathers remain at these ruined missions, carrying on as best they can. This is Fr. Salako's Province. He has been able to travel far and wide through his territory by means of the new truck which our parish donation to him last year was able to buy.



We are glad to have the opportunity to be able to contribute to the support of one field of the Church's mission in such a personal way through Father Salako.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: JULY 16th, A.D. 2017 SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA

for this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha (July 14). Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

"O God, who desired the Virgin Saint Kateri Tekakwitha to flower among Native Americans in a life of innocence, grant, through her intercession, that when all are gathered into Your Church from every nation, tribe and tongue, they may magnify You in a single canticle of praise. Through our Lord, etc."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

- 1. O God (address),
- 2. Who desired the Virgin Saint Kateri Tekakwitha to flower among Native Americans in a life of innocence (ascription),
- 3. Grant that all may magnify You in a single canticle of praise (petition),
- 4. (a) through her intercession (motive for the petition), (b) when all gathered into Your Church from every nation, tribe and tongue (motive for the petition),
- 5. Through Our Lord. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If Kateri's purity testifies to God's universal salvific will.
- B) And if Kateria prays for the Church and the success of its mission for the salvation of the world
- C) Then the Church's faithful will one day be united with her and the Blessed Virgin Mary in heaven, forever magnifying the Lord.

Today's Collect highlights the Church's mission ad *Gentes*, i.e., "to the all the nations," a mission given directly by Jesus Himself to His Apostles immediately prior to His Ascension (cf. Mt. 28:18-20, Mk. 16:15-18, Acts 1:8).

The "third mark" or characteristic of the Church in the Apostles' Creed is that she is "Catholic," that is, that she exists to extend the Gospel to all peoples and cultures of all times and places (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church nos. 775, 830-831). The heroic lives of North American Saints such as Saint Kateri testify



to the on-going fulfillment of Jesus' mandate for His Church.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680) dedicated her whole life to Christ in prayer, with a special devotion to the Holy Eucharist, as well as to Our Lady and the Rosary. She also participated regularly in the Church's liturgical evening prayer of Vespers. The chanting of Our Lady's Magnificat (cf. Luke 1:46-55) is the highlight of Vespers, wherein Mary praises God for His mercy and his plan of salvation. This canticle would have been a central prayer in Saint Kateri's spirituality. Our Collect alludes to this in its petition, which likens the Church of all nations magnifying the Lord like Our Lady in her Magnificat. Saint Kateri's life is a powerful demonstration of the on-going fulfillment of this canticle in the Church's universal mission.

Saint Kateri's life also demonstrates robustly to the world that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (cf. Lumen Gentium no. 11, Sacrosanctum Concilium no. 10, and Catechism nos. 1324, 1074). The Church's mission "is to put people...in communion, in intimacy, with Jesus Christ," the highest and fullest expression of which is Holy Communion (St. John Paul II, Catechesi Tradendae no. 5; Catechism nos. 1074, 1391-2). May Saint Kateri help us to prize nothing above union with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. May she help us to lead others to this same living union with Jesus in His Church.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 27: 8-9 The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. *Psalm 27:* 8-9 Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Romans 6: 3-11 Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin.

GRADUAL: Psalm 89: 13, 1 Return, O Lord, a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. *V.* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. ALLELUIA: Psalm 30: 2-3 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me; bow down Thy ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Mark 8: 1-9 At that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 16: 5, 6-7 Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths, that my footsteps be not moved: incline Thy ear, and hear my words: show forth Thy wonderful mercies, Thou who savest them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

SECRET Be appeased, O Lord, by our supplications, and graciously accept these offerings of Thy people: neither suffering the hope of anyone to be in vain, nor his prayer to remain unheard, that we may obtain that for which we faithfully pray. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: Psalm 26: 6 I will go round, and offer up in His tabernacle a sacrifice of jubilation; I will sing, and recite a psalm to the Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION Grant, O Lord, that we who have been filled with Thy gifts may be cleansed by their virtue and strengthened by their help. Through our Lord.






