SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: SEPTEMBER 24th, 2017 OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the memorial of Our Lady of Walsingham, celebrated on September 24th. This feast is particular to the Catholic Church in England, as well as the Personal Ordinariates throughout the world. Below is the day's Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010) particular to the dioceses of England and Wales:

"Grant, we pray, almighty God, that as in the mystery of the Incarnation the Blessed and ever Virgin Mary conceived Your Son in her heart before she conceived Him in the womb, so we, Your pilgrim people, rejoicing in her motherly care, may welcome Him into our hearts and become a holy house fit for His eternal dwelling. Who lives and reigns, etc. Amen."

In 1061 A.D., Our Lady appeared to a noblewoman named Richeldis de Faverches, and, having shown her her house in Nazareth, requested that a replica be made in Walsingham for the purpose of pilgrimage. For almost five hundred years, pilgrims from all over England visited Walsingham, whose chief charism was the commemoration of the Annunciation. Both St. Edward the Confessor and Richard II consecrated England to Mary as her "dowry," that is, her gift. Sadly, Henry VIII destroyed the Abbey and its shrine in 1538 (it lies in ruins to this day). In recent times, both Anglicans and Catholics have revived pilgrimages and rebuilt their respective shrines near the original one, and the Anglican shrine contains a replica of the first Holy House. [Cf. Fr. Michael Rear, Walsingham: Pilgrims and Pilgrimage, St. Pauls UK, 2011.]

This past August, my wife Ellen and I made a pilgrimage to Walsingham. The divine peace of Mary's presence there builds on the natural serenity of the beautiful Norfolk countryside. Receiving the Sacraments under Mary's mantle at "England's Nazareth" was a special grace. To walk and pray where our ancestors very likely walked and prayed is an experience that can hardly be put into words.

The strength and continuity of our Catholic patrimony across the ages was quite palpable.

In the Collect, the ascription clause rehearses the teaching we find in St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas regarding Our Lady's two conceptions of Christ in the Annunciation. She received the Divine Word in her ears and in her heart first (cf. Lk. 11:27-28). Her heart was open to God, and thereby prepared to offer her *fiat* and to receive Christ into her womb. This is the mystery of the Annunciation, and it is the mystery of our own lives: Jesus offers His Gospel to us, indeed, He offers *Himself* to us through sacramental grace, and we are called to the divine embrace, like Mary.

The petition, motive, and hoped-for outcome clauses of the Collect indicate that we are pilgrims in this world (an homage to the centuries of pilgrimage at Walsingham). We are called to heaven, and so, we depend absolutely upon the grace of the seven Sacraments ("welcome him into our hearts") as well as Our Lady's care and intercession ("rejoicing in her motherly care") until we reach our final Beatitude. Sacramental grace and Our Lady are not optional for our Catholic way of life; they are constitutive to our salvation.

Marian shrines powerfully remind us of these truths. Such shrines assure us of Our Lord and Our Lady's unfailing and miraculous help in our pilgrimage of life. In receiving sacramental grace, we become Tabernacles, like Our Lady herself, and our homes become "holy houses," just like the home of the Holy Family in Nazareth until we reach the heavenly Mansion/Tabernacle with "many rooms" that Jesus promises us (cf. Jn 14:2-3). This is both the essence and the telos (the end or purpose) of the Christian way of life. This is what makes Walsingham so magnificent: its spirituality is the core message of the Gospel, and thus, it is so wonderfully and unendingly rich. (David Allen)

And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place: and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee, cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher. Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself, shall be humbled; and he that humbleth himself, shall be exalted. —




