He propagated this form of prayer in obedience to a revelation received from the Blessed Virgin, to whom he had recourse for this purpose, about the year 1206, and to him was due the spread of a devotion, which for many centuries has produced the most marvelous results in the Christian world. The decisive defeat of the Turks at the famous battle of Lepanto (A.D. 1571) and at Belgrade (A.D. 1716) gave occasion both to the institution of this Feast and to its extension to the Universal Church. Pastor's Note

PARISH ANNUAL REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017

This Sunday I am publishing our Parish Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1st, 2016-June 30th, 2017). Photocopies of the detailed reports for Mary Immaculate of Lourdes Parish and its parish cemetery of St. Mary's are available in the vestibule of the rectory for those who would like to take them. I will summarize the reports here in this column.



ST. MARY'S CEMETERY

The parish cemetery ended the Fiscal Year with a positive balance of <u>**\$40,000**</u> (income less

expenses) This provided us with a modest financial cushion going into the new Fiscal Year. We were able to add **§91,534** to the Perpetual Care Fund. I want to express my gratitude to parishioner Ron Goguen and his family team of Guardian Estate Management for the excellent and reverent care that they are giving to St. Mary's. I also want to express my thanks to Margie Bibbo who runs the cemetery office and to our business manager Sharon Hogan for their dedicated professional work.



MARY IMMACULATE OF LOURDES

Total Income for the parish this past Fiscal Year was <u>\$523,495</u>. Expenses totaled: <u>\$736.830</u>. This left us with a deficit of: (<u>\$204,335</u>) Fortunately we were still able to cover the revenue shortfall from our parish endowment, but that has taken another huge chunk out of our resources. It undermines the parish's longer term future and it increases the pressure to close the gap before we reach the tipping point where we cannot cover the revenue shortfall anymore from our savings.

The parish did better in revenues than budgeted **(\$153,000)**, primarily through **\$81,000** in other donations and **\$24,000** in gifts and bequests. We were **\$11,000** under-budget in terms of Total Expenses.

The analysis of our Parish Giving shows that ten donors accounted for 45% of last year's donations, 66% of the total donors gave less than \$20-per-week, and 84% gave less than \$50-per-week.

My message in the face of these numbers is the same one I have consistently been giving to you: if we want to keep our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes open then we are going to have to pay for it. Nobody else is going to pay for it. Nobody else *should* pay for it. It is the responsibility of the community of the faithful *who are already here* to support their church through a stewardship level of giving born of their own faith-commitment. There has to be a commitment to a sustained level of sacrifice. The sacrifice also has to be broadly shared. It should not be only a small percentage of parish households making the real financial sacrifices.

In the coming weeks we will be rolling out a Pledge Campaign for the next year—between the First Sunday of Advent and November 24th, 2018 (the 108th Anniversary of the Dedication of our Parish Church). Please start to consider what you might be able to do for our parish in the coming year.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: OCTOBER 1st, 2017 THE HOLY GUARDIAN ANGELS

 f or this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels, celebrated on October 2. This Collect is identical in both forms of the Mass. Below is the Collect's translation in the Angelus Press edition of the Daily Roman Missal (MR '62):

"O God, Who in Thine ineffable Providence hast deigned to send Thy holy Angels to keep watch over us: grant to us Thy suppliant people, that we may always be defended by their protection, and may rejoice in their fellowship for ever. Through our Lord."

The feast of the Holy Guardian Angels renders the entire month of October particularly devoted to the Holy Angels [October is simultaneously devoted to the Holy Rosary]. Like the feasts of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, this feast provides us an opportunity to celebrate God's providence, that is, His infinitely wise watch-care, guidance, and protection of us and all people. For thousands of years, Scripture and Tradition have been brimming over with countless examples of divine intervention through the Holy Angels. I imagine some of you could testify with moral certainty to a miraculous experience which you ascribe to your Guardian Angel.

Truth be told, whether or not we realize it, each of us experiences *many* graces, whether temporal or spiritual, which may be linked to the Holy Angels on a sound basis. In his excellent and systematic study, *The Angels and Their Mission*, Fr. Jean Danielou, S.J. shows us that Biblical, extra-Biblical, Patristic, and liturgical sources demonstrate that God is continually dispensing grace to everyone through the ministry of Angels, even if man is not always receptive to these graces (Danielou, *The Angels and Their Mission*, see especially chapters 1-2). This is what the Collect means when it acclaims God's providence, as it is mediated through his Angels, as "*ineffable*," or "*unfathomable*," as the ICEL translation of the Collect puts it. In other words, God's watchcare over us through His Angels is so wonderfully mysterious and wise, that the interventions of His grace transcend our limited understanding and perception.

When speaking about Angels, we must always be careful to avoid thinking too simplistically or egotistically about the divine Will. We also must avoid thinking that angelic protection means that we can fathom the mystery of evil or avoid suffering altogether. Our Guardian Angels do not take us down from the Cross. On the contrary, they help us to carry our Cross, just as an Angel was sent to strengthen Jesus in the Agony in the Garden (cf. Lk. 22:43). Indeed, God's gift to us of Guardian Angels is one compelling reason (among many others) to trust in His mercy and benevolence, which are at the very heart of His ineffable providence for each of us, even during our suffering. Hence, our dual petition: that our Angels may continue to protect us, and that we may find joy in their companionship both now and in heaven.

From childhood, many Catholics learn a simple rhyming prayer to their Guardian Angel:


"Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom His love entrusts me here: ever this day be at my side, to light and to guard, to rule and to guide. Amen."

This prayer is such a simple way for us to develop a greater attentiveness to God's providence and love. Let us stand in awe of the invisible workings of divine grace, thanking God for the fact that, long before time began, He planned to assign one of His Holy Angels to guard and protect us throughout our brief time on this earth (cf. Psalms 91 and 139).





EPISTLE: From the Book of Proverbs, 8. 22-24; 32-35. THE LORD possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning, I was set up from eternity and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: Blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

Who having heard, was troubled at his saying: and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the Angel said to her: Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God: behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call His Name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father: and He shall reign in the house of Jacob for ever, and of His kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the Angel: How shall this be done, because I know not man? And the Angel answering, said to her: The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren: because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

OFFERTORY: Eccl. 24. 25; 39. 17. IN me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have borne fruit.

SECRET: ENABLE us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be fittingly prepared for offering these gifts, and through the Mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to meditate upon the life, passion, and glory of Thine only begotten Son, that we may be made worthy of His promises: Who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

COMMUNION: Eccl. 39. 19. SEND forth flowers, as the lily, and yield a fragrance, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.


