SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: OCTOBER 15th, 2017 ST. EDWARD THE CONFESSOR

J or this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of St. Edward the Confessor, celebrated on October 13 (MR '62). Below is the unofficial translation of the Collect in the Angelus Press edition of the *Daily Roman Missal*:

"O God, Who hast crowned blessed King Edward, Thy Confessor, with eternal glory, make us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate him on earth, that we may be able to reign with him in heaven. Through our Lord. Amen."

St. Edward, King of England from 1042-1066, is given the title "Confessor," because of his holiness of life, and his protection and promotion of the Church in his reign. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in nos. 898ff. does a marvelous job explaining the rights and responsibilities proper to the lay state. St. Edward is among those lay faithful in Church history who lived these teachings to the full. Here are some excerpts:

898 "'By reason of their special vocation it belongs to the laity to seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and directing them according to God's will...'"

899 "The initiative of lay Christians is necessary especially when the matter involves discovering or inventing the means for permeating social, political, and economic realities with the demands of Christian doctrine and life."

900 "...lay Christians are entrusted by God with the apostolate by virtue of their Baptism and Confirmation, they have the right and duty...to work so that the divine message of salvation may be known and accepted by all men throughout the earth."

901 "For all their works, prayers, and apostolic undertakings, family and married life, daily work, relaxation of mind and body, if they are accomplished in the Spirit - indeed even the hardships of life if patiently born - all these become spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. In the celebration of the Eucharist these may most fittingly be offered to the Father along with

the body of the Lord. And so, worshipping everywhere by their holy actions, the laity consecrate the world itself to God, everywhere offering worship by the holiness of their lives.'" 908 "By his obedience unto death, Christ communicated to his disciples the gift of royal freedom, so that they might 'by the self-abnegation of a holy life, overcome the reign of sin in themselves'"

The following are the credits for which St. Edward is commonly known: his deep piety, his chastity, his alms to the poor, and his rebuilding of Westminster Abbey. This latter item especially, indicates the primacy he gave to the Church's worship and what he perceived to be the irreplaceable contribution of ecclesial and monastic life to England. Though he was a king, St. Edward nevertheless manifests the ideal for all the faithful in whatever their sphere, because all the baptized share in Christ's kingship. As we can see in the paragraphs above, the path to sanctity is open to us all: by ruling over sin and growing in holiness, by witnessing to Christ in words and deeds, by exercising good stewardship, and by being generous to the Church and to the poor, we all can become saints and reign with Saint Edward in heaven.

COLLECT Almighty, merciful and forgiving God, remove everything that might hinder us: and thus freed in body and soul, may we with full liberty seek Thy will. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Ephesians, 4. 23-28. Brethren: Be ye renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who according to God is created in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry, and sin not. Let not the sun go down upon your anger. Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more; but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, 22. 1-14. At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the pharisees in parables, saying: The Kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fattlings are killed, and all things are ready: come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants: The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests; and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment: and he saith to him: Friend, how camest thou in hither not having on a wedding garment? But he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters: Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen.




