Pastor's Note

"TO THEE, O LORD, I LIFT UP MY SOUL"

De enter once more into this Season of the Lord's Advent in preparation for the Feast of Christmas. An important part of the Season is to be aware of the two-fold motion going on between God and us: on the one side God "comes" or "appears", and on the other side man (we) "goeth forth to meet Him". This is well-expressed in the Collect Prayer for this First Sunday of Advent (1970 Missal):


Grant, Almighty Father, that when Christ comes again we may go out to meet Him, bearing the harvest of good works achieved by Your grace. We pray that He will receive us in into the company of the saints and call us into the kingdom of heaven.

Psalm 24(25) is used for the Introit Psalm in today's Mass (for both forms) and it expresses well the longing of the human heart for God. It speaks of confidence in God's mercy and faithfulness, true sorrow for sin, and the desire for following the way of God's truth: "Make me to know Thy ways, O Lord; teach me Thy paths. Lead me in Thy truth, and teach me, for Thou art the God of my salvation; for Thee I wait all the day long." (vv. 4-5)

Besides Psalm 24(25), three other Psalms are used in the versicles of the Advent-Mass Introits to re-enforce the theme of man going forth to meet God even as He comes to us. They are Psalm 79(80) *Sunday III*, Psalm 84(85) *Sunday III* (Gaudete), and Psalm 18(19) *Sunday IV* (Rorate).

A good spiritual exercise for these Advent days would be to read the full text of all four of these Advent season Psalms and make them our companions in our preparation for Christ's coming with His grace to us at Christmas.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: DECEMBER 3rd, 2017 ST. JOHN DAMASCENE

J or this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the feast of St. John of Damascus, Priest and Doctor of the Church, celebrated in the new calendar on December 4. Below is the day's Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

"Grant, we pray, O Lord, that we may be helped by the prayers of the Priest Saint John Damascene, so that the true faith, which he excelled in teaching, may always be our light and our strength. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

St. John of Damascus lived from the middle of the seventh century through the middle of the eight century, a critical time in Church history which saw the rising tide of Muslim invasion of Christian lands, and the mushrooming of the heresy of iconoclasm (literally, the "breaking of icons"). This heresy equated the veneration of images of Christ and the Saints with idolatry, and consequently, incited many to destroy such images and ban them from liturgical and devotional use. The Seventh Ecumenical Council, which met under the Byzantine Empress Irene at Nicaea in 787 A.D. (also known as Nicaea II), flatly condemned the heresy of iconoclasm. Its teaching is indebted to the writings of St. John of Damascus, among others, which is why he is one of the Doctors of the Church.

St. John's teaching centers on the Incarnation, and consequently, man's ability to see and worship the face of God in Christ. In our Collect, we ask that this very teaching may be our *light* and our *strength*. We are asking, firstly, that our minds may be enlightened with the true faith in regard to the mystery of the Incarnation, namely, that Christ is true God and true man, for this is central to our salvation. Secondly, we pray that this consoling truth of God's love in Christ may fortify us for living the life of grace.

Consider paragraphs 515 and 476-477 from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, which explain these truths of the Incarnation:

515 "...His humanity appeared as 'sacrament,' that is, the sign and instrument, of His divinity and of the salvation He brings: what was visible in His earthly life leads to the invisible mystery of His divine sonship and redemptive mission." 476 "Since the Word became flesh in assuming a true humanity, Christ's



body was finite. Therefore the human face of Jesus can be portrayed; at the seventh ecumenical council (Nicaea II in 787) the Church recognized its representation in holy images to be legitimate."
477 "At the same time the Church has always acknowledged that in the Body of Jesus 'we see our God made visible and so are caught up in love of the God we cannot see.' The individual characteristics of Christ's Body express the Divine Person of God's Son. He has made the features of His human body His own, to the point that they can be venerated when portrayed in a holy image, for the believer 'who venerates the icon is venerating in it the Person of the one depicted.'"

When we adore the Divine Baby in the manger-crib in just a few weeks, we will profess that Christ is fully God and fully man, and that these two natures are inseparable in His One Divine Person. To kiss the flesh of Christ is to adore Him as our God, and to thank Him for His unfathomable love for us. *Venite adoremus Dominum!*



INTROIT: Psalm 24. 1-4. Show me, O Lord, Thy ways: and teach me Thy paths. ℣. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — To Thee ...

COLLECT: STIR up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, we may deserve to be rescued by Thy protection, and be saved by Thy deliverance: Who livest and reignest with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.




Embracing his vocation, embracing God's people

Father Anthony Cusack grappled with his vocation as a young man. After hearing God's call to the priesthood, he embraced a life of service to every person placed before him in ministry.

Recognizing the growing needs of ethnic communities, Father Anthony broadened his pastoral skills by learning to celebrate Mass in both Spanish and Vietnamese. This enabled him to accept his first assignment at St. Ambrose and St. Mark Parishes in 2015.

Today, Father Anthony ministers in the heart of Dorchester. He engages the community in three very different languages. When summarizing his responsibilities, he describes personifying Christ: "The duty of the priest is, I think, to be Jesus to every single person he meets."




