THE EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION FOR 2018 IN THE YEAR OF GRACE (The Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts:)

Know, dear brethren, that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection who is our Savior:

The Sunday of Septuagesima is the 28th Day of January.

On the 14th Day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the Fast of the most sacred Lenten Season.

On the 1st Day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 10th Day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 20th Day of May, the Feast of Pentecost.

On the 31st Day of May, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

On the 2nd Day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.





IHS = Symbol of the Holy Name of Jesus

St. Bernardine of Siena (+1444 A.D.) spread devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus ("Jesus" means "Yahweh Is Salvation") by means of the inscription of the monogram IHS. It is an abbreviation of the name "Jesus" by using the first three letters of the Lord's Name according to the Greek alphabet (The New Testament of the Bible was originally written in Greek). St. Bernardine also popularized the addition of the name "Jesus" to the "Hail Mary"— "Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, JESUS."




