## Pastor's Note

## THE MAGISTERIAL TEACHINGS OF POPE SAINT PAUL VI

As we launch out into this New Year 2019, I would like to dedicate a significant space in our weekly bulletin to highlighting some of the magisterial teachings of Pope Paul VI, who was canonized a Saint of the Catholic Church a few months ago. We will begin with the *Credo of the People of God* which was proclaimed at the close of the Year of Faith, June 29th, 1968.

In the words of Fr. John Hardon, S.J.:

Its purpose was to offer to the Christian world, after the Second Vatican Council, a profession of the principle articles of the Catholic Faith. It is no mere summary, however, but a carefully assembled synthesis of those revealed truths which today are either most challenged or that especially need to be understood by the faithful. It incorporates all the familiar doctrines of the Nicene Creed but goes beyond them in occasionally updating the verbal expression and showing how these mysteries are to be lived by the Christian believer.


# CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE PRINCIPLES OF CHRISTIANITY

## THE CREDO OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

(The SOLEMN PROFESSION OF FAITH)

r. With this solemn liturgy We end the celebration of the Nineteenth Centenary of the Martyrdom of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, and thus close the Year of Faith. We dedicated it to the commemoration of the Holy Apostles in order

- 1. *(continued...)* that we might give witness to our steadfast will to *guard the deposit of faith* from corruption, that deposit which they transmitted to us, and to demonstrate again our intention of relating this same faith to life, at this time when the Church must continue her pilgrimage in this world.
- 2. We feel it Our duty to give public thanks to all who responded to Our invitation by bestowing on the Year of Faith a splendid completeness through the deepening of their personal adhesion to the Word of God, through the renewal in various gatherings of the Profession of Faith, and through the testimony of Christian life. To Our brothers in the episcopate especially, and to all the faithful of the Holy Catholic Church, We express our appreciation and we grant Our blessing.
- 3. Likewise, we deem that We must fulfill the mandate entrusted by Christ to Peter, whose successor We are, the last in merit; namely to confirm Our brothers in the faith. With the awareness, certainly, of Our human weakness, yet with all the strength impressed on Our spirit by such a command, We shall accordingly make a Profession of Faith, pronounce a formula which begins with the word Credo, I believe. Without being strictly speaking a dogmatic definition. it repeats in substance, with some developments called for by the spiritual condition of our time, the Creed of Nicaea, the Creed of the immortal tradition of the Holy Church of God.

THE EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION FOR 2019 IN THE YEAR OF GRACE (The Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts:)

Know, dear brethren, that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection who is our Savior:

The Sunday of Septuagesima is the 17th Day of February.

On the 6th Day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the Fast of the most sacred Lenten Season.

On the 21st Day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 30th Day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 9th Day of June, the Feast of Pentecost.

On the 20th Day of June, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

On the 1st Day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

## **SCRIPTURE STUDY**

## COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL SUNDAY, JANUARY 13th, 2019:

Baptism of the Lord: Missale Romanum 1970

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider today's Collect for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (MR '70). Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010):

"Almighty ever-living God, Who, when Christ had been baptized in the River Jordan and as the Holy Spirit descended upon Him, solemnly declared Him Your beloved Son, grant that Your children by adoption, reborn of water and the Holy Spirit, may always be well pleasing to You. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

Our Collect's petition affirms that the faithful have become God's adopted children by His divine action in Baptism. As St. John tells us in his First Epistle, "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are" (cf. 1 Jn. 3:1, RSV). Consequently, the baptized truly share in the very same benediction which the Father gave to Christ at the Jordan: "This is My beloved Son, with Whom I am well pleased" (cf. Mt. 3:17, RSV).

Accordingly, our petition begs God for the grace of always abiding in this benediction. How does this come about? Fortunately, it is *God Himself* who has already (and permanently) rooted us in this filial identity. Our principal vocation, then, is simply to cooperate with this grace (this is the correct sense of the petition).

The Sacrament of Baptism imprints upon the soul an indelible *character*, a seal, or a mark. In Biblical terms, sacramental character indicates that we are related to God in an eternal and irrevocable covenant (this is wondrously good news!). The principle Old Testament prototype of (*cont. on pg. 6*)

(continued from pg. 5...) baptismal character is circumcision, the permanent mark in the flesh that indicated Israel's belonging to God in the Abrahamic covenant.

Here is what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says on the subject of sacramental character:

1272: "Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, the person baptized is configured to Christ. Baptism seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark (character) of his belonging to Christ. No sin can erase this mark, even if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation. Given once for all, Baptism cannot be repeated."

1273: "Incorporated into the Church by Baptism, the faithful have received the sacramental character that consecrates them for Christian religious worship. The baptismal seal enables and commits Christians to serve God by a vital participation in the holy liturgy of the Church and to exercise their baptismal priesthood by the witness of holy lives and practical charity."

1274: "The Holy Spirit has marked us with the seal of the Lord ('Dominicus character') 'for the day of redemption.' 'Baptism indeed is the seal of eternal life.' The faithful Christian who has 'kept the seal' until the end, remaining faithful to the demands of his Baptism, will be able to depart this life 'marked with the sign of faith,' with his baptismal faith, in expectation of the blessed vision of God - the consummation of faith - and in the hope of resurrection."

1121: "...This configuration to Christ and to the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible, it remains for ever in the Christian as a positive disposition for grace, a promise and guarantee of divine protection, and as a vocation to divine worship and to the service of the Church..."

Of chief importance in these paragraphs is the point that the sacramental character of Baptism is ordered to divine worship. In other words, Baptism gives the children of God the supernatural power to participate in the Sacrifice of the Mass, and so, to offer to God the divinely revealed worship that He desires and commands of His creatures, i.e., the Holy Eucharist (cf. Lk. 22:19-20; Jn. 4 and 6). Rendering such worship is possible for us because Christ "associates [His] Church" with His Offering on the Cross, of which His own Baptism is the

foreshadowing (*Catechism*, nos. 536-7, 1070-1, 1073-4, 1085, 1089, 1115, 1119, 1141; Ratzinger, Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration, 18-23; Bl. Marmion, *Christ in His Mysteries*, 20, 206).

Thus, the whole of Christian life rests squarely upon baptismal character. It orients us and all of life to divine worship and to growth in charity. This is how we "may always be well pleasing" to the Father.






