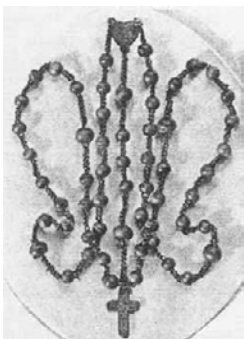

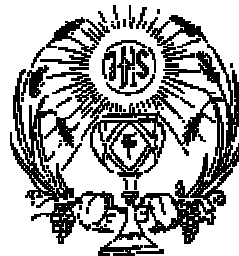

“COME, HOLY GHOST, CREATOR BLEST”

With joy we welcome His Excellency Bishop Walter Edyvean to our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes this Sunday for the conferral of the Sacrament of Confirmation. You will find the list of names of those to be confirmed along with the Confirmation Names and the Sponsors on pages 6-7 of this week's bulletin.

Of the Seven Sacraments, Confirmation is the last of the three Sacraments of Christian Initiation—Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. It is a “confirmation” in the vows of Christian baptism, with its own special sacramental grace to strengthen the soul for Christian living. The outward signs of the Sacrament of Confirmation are the laying on

of hands by the Bishop, the anointing on the forehead with holy chrism and the liturgical prayer. The inward effect is an indelible character imprinted on the confirmand's soul. For this reason Confirmation—like Baptism—can only be received once in a person's lifetime.

St. Thomas Aquinas (A.D. 1225-1274) makes a distinction between the “fighters of Christ” (the confirmed) and the simple members of Christ's Kingdom (all the non-confirmed baptized). Confirmation not only empowers, but entitles, those who have received it to both preserve their own faith and make public profession of it. (*Fr. John Hardon, S.J.: Modern Catholic Dictionary, 1999*) It is the Sacrament for martyrdom and for mission.

The custom of taking a Confirmation name expresses several things, among them, that the confirmand has consciously entered upon a new way of life as a witness of Christ, drawing inspiration from the Christian witness of the person whose name he has chosen to add to his own. A wide variety of names has been chosen by our Confirmandi for today which shows the careful thought put into their selection by our young people.

Without in any way presuming on our own strength or virtue we look to the heroes of the faith—the Saints—for light to know how to accomplish our own human duty on this earth. In his recent book *A Crisis of Saints: The Call to Heroic Faith in an Unheroic World*, Fr. George Rutler (who will be speaking here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes next month on October 17th) writes: “...Each turning point in history is a test of holiness, and the saints make the big difference in the world's fortunes. As a corollary to this, since holiness is marked by heroic virtue, the real danger to society is not merely a lack of virtue, but a lack of heroism. Moral weakness was the bane of the last years of the twentieth century, and not less so in the life of the Church.”

FR. GEORGE W. RUTLER will speak on “CRISIS OF SAINTS—HOLINESS IN THE YEAR OF FAITH”

Father Rutler served as an Episcopalian priest for nine years before he was received into the Catholic Church in 1979. He has authored 15 books on theology, history, cultural issues and lives of the saints, including *The Curé of*

Ars Today, *Coincidentally*, and *A*

Crisis of Saints. He is the host of the EWTN program “*Christ in the City*” where he discusses the possibilities of encountering Christ in fast-paced city life. Fr. Rutler holds degrees from several colleges including Oxford University and the Gregorian and Angelicum Universities in Rome. He was honored by the New York Council for his assistance to the dying at the World Trade Center on September 11th, 2001. Fr. Rutler has been pastor of the Church of Our Savior parish in New York City since 2001.

“As it was in the sixteenth century, so it is now, only now it is amplified by larger populations. Reform now, as always, will come about by addressing the meaning and purpose of the human being. The worst times in history have been caused by neglect of these realities; the best times have been the work of people humble enough to be shocked into the truth by the ugliness of such neglect. It can never be said enough: any crisis in culture is a crisis of saints, and no reform is radical enough unless it is a redemption from sin.”

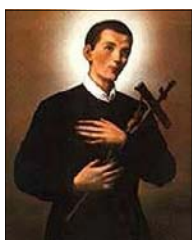
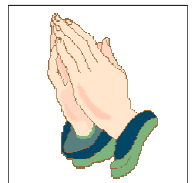

By this Purgatorial Society, the names of our dead friends and relatives may be enrolled (either as individuals or in aggregate), and prayed for especially in the 52 Masses that will be offered in the parish each year for the intention of the Purgatorial Society. The requested offering for a perpetual enrollment is \$20.00. (White leatherette enrollment envelopes are available in the vestibule of the rectory.) The prayers we have offered at Mass for the souls of the faithful departed are both an expression of our belief in individual survival after the event of bodily death and of a charity towards our neighbor which reaches beyond the grave.

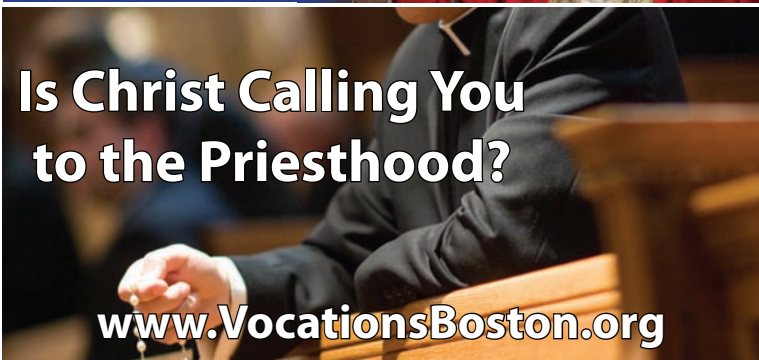
