DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE DIVINE INFANCY



(Front Cover: Stained glass window of the Saint Anne and her daughter Mary. This window is located on the confessional of the Oak Street side of our parish church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes. A recent addition to the interior of our main church as part of the construction of the confessionals in 2009, it was formerly in a convent of Poor Clares. As the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the grandmother of Jesus, St. Anne holds an honorable place in salvation history. LATE ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS

Catholic piety has embellished the last nine days of Advent, from December 16th to Christmas Eve on December 24th, with touching devotions to the Child Jesus. In Latin America the Novena of the Child Jesus is well-celebrated both in church and in the home with a spirit of Christmas joy.

These are days to decorate the parish church and our homes for the Christmas feast. The manger scene is set-up in advance of Christmas Eve—but the Crib is left empty until Christmas Eve itself.

Another custom, originating in France, has the children of the house preparing a soft-bedding for the Christ Child on Christmas Eve by laying strands of straw in the empty manger in token of good deeds or devotions performed. Thus the Christ Child finds a warm, soft bed of straw from the children on the Holy Night.

One of the most important ways we can push back against the secularization and the commercialization of Christmas into "The Holidays" is to continue our religious celebration of Christmas past the calendar date of December 25th. Celebrate intensely the Twelve Days of Christmas (Christmas Eve-January 5th, "Twelfth Night", and mark January 6th as the pinnacle of the whole Season—the Epiphany of the Lord, "The Feast of the Three Kings." In the USA the external observance of the Epiphany has been transferred to the first Sunday after January 1st, which disrupts the flow of the Feast somewhat. This year, however, January 6th falls on a Sunday.

As you will read on the next page of the bulletin, we are hosting our Christmas Open House at the rectory this year on Epiphany Sunday, January 6th, from 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend.


